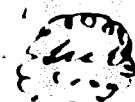

I Robert Hurdman of County of Mecklenburg & State of North Carolina, being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory Thanks in to God, in it & calling to mind the mortality of my body, do make & make public this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows That is to say first, That all my personal & choses be & be sold & disposed of as I shall direct, Secondly I give & bequeath the whole my estate with Tracts & land in his last & former... Crops & & choses & furniture & his maintenance of the improvements his life time; Thirdly I do also give & bequeath unto my oldest son Charles Hurdman the sum of one Dollar to be paid to him out of the proceeds of the property; Fourthly I do also give & bequeath unto my son Edward Hurdman the sum of ten dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of the property. Fifthly I do also give & bequeath unto my son George Hurdman part of my Land lying on the north side of Chatham Creek beginning at a post betwixt Charles Hurdman's corner, thence to a small oak tree near the old school house spring, thence to a marked Hickory on the bank of Mill Creek thence down the various current of said creek to a oak Garrison's line bounding Sarah Garrison, & George Galloway, & Charles Hurdman's line to him the said George Hurdman his heirs & assigns to have & to hold forever by him & his heirs & assigns of, only dollars to be

Equally divided between the three girls, I do also give & bequeath unto the three Daughters Rachel, Jean Elsie, & Edith Elsie & said Daughters to have their living on the old part of the land so long as they live single or should prefer to live on it, I do give & bequeath unto my youngest son Robert the remaining part of my land standing in Mecklenburg and under Sarah Garrison, George H. Buchanan, Charles Buchanan, Dennis Gury & William H. King's lines to him the said Robert his Heirs & assigns to have & to hold forever by his maintaining his mother her life term on decree & the girls so long as they stay with him And I give & bequeath unto my youngest son Robert all the moveable effects that is not above mentioned by him & by in all the just debts coming against my estate and I hereby appoint my beloved wife Tracy Buchanan & George H. Buchanan and the Executors of this my last will & Testament, hereby Revoking & disannulling all wills & former wills by me made, maintain- ing this to be my last will & Testament, In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of July in the Year of our Lord 1810 -
