disposed off to make her a bed -

In consideration or remainder of my property if there be any I  
bequeath to my son William Caldwell to dispose of as he may  
think proper, whom I do hereby constitute & appoint  
together with his son Johnstone to be my Executors and to  
execute this my last will & Testament. In witness I have  
executed to my hand this day of January AD 1830

For the use of Jack Brown -

I Robert Caldwell of this County of ~~Rockingham~~<sup>Rockingham</sup> State  
of N. Carolina, Being in a weak state of health, best off would make  
a minority before I die for the same; Do make & retain this  
my last will & Testament in the manner & form following Viz  
I shall my spirit to God that you all, having body to be  
dearly beloved in the earth, be the full appearance of  
the resurrection of the dead; And as for my worldly  
 substance I dispose of as follows Viz

I will bequeath that my little wife Phoebe live on  
the plantation on which I now live for lifetime & her  
daughter Margaret with her while she remains single  
they are to have Jack & Jim to work for them while  
they live together Margaret is to have a negro girl  
named Mat. three children when she leaves the place  
I will to my son John a negro girl named Kelly  
I will to my son William a negro boy Chucky  
I will to my son Daniel a negro boy Great -

I will one negro boy Littleton to be divided equally  
 between my two sons John & Daniel. I will a negro  
 boy named Wilson to my son James, I will one negro  
 boy Loring to my two sons Robert & James to be divided  
 & Robert to pay half the valuation to James & equally  
 and keep him all. I will one negro boy named Dick  
 to my son Silas, I will a negro girl named Dick to him  
 with its mother while my widow lives & then to be sold  
 with its mother & each & equally divided amongst  
 all my children. I will to my son Robert a negro girl  
 named Rosetta, & to my beloved wife Mrs. Lucy  
 her pick, & to Margaret our daughter her third  
 pick, I will to my daughter Margaret all her Wives  
 and Beds & Clothes that she has made above & some  
 more also two hundred dollars, I will my wife  
 two horses & a mule & all the other bedding also a heavy  
 wagon, hats & a will to my daughter Margaret our  
 hundred & fifty acres of Land joining the pine hills of  
 the Blue mountains except Head & the said land to be  
 divided between John & James Baldwells about 50  
 also from Baldwins river, one pot, two bowls & a spit all  
 to be divided, I do will to my son Silas two horses and to  
 William Gray, all the horses and kitchen utensils  
 to remain another plantation for the use of my wife  
 during her life. William Gray equally divided amongst  
 my heirs. My wagon to remain as a plantation  
 for the use of my family, my little wagon to be sold.  
 Lastly I appoint John & Robert Baldwells my executors  
 of this my last will & Testament, he writing whereof  
 I hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this 3<sup>d</sup> day  
 of November in the year of our Lord 1832.
