5th To my son William's daughter Nancy I give & bequeath all
my feathers which are not in the two beds I have before
disposed off to make her a bed.

The residue or remainder of my property if there be any I
bequeath to my son William Caldwell to dispose of as he may
think proper, to whom I do hereby constitute & appoint
together with the Rev. John Tomlinson my Executors and to
execute this my last will & testament. In Witness I have
hereunto set my hand & the day of January AD 1830

I Robert Caldwell of this County of Wakehampton & State
of N. Carolina, being in a sound state of health, best of sound mind
& memory blessed be God for the same; Do make & declare this
my last will & Testament in the manner & form following Viz
I will my spirit to God that gives it, & my body to be
decently interred in the earth. In the full assurance of
the resurrection of the dead, and as for my worldly
substance I dispose of as follows Viz

I will & bequeath that my daughter Phoebe live on
the plantation on which I now live her lifetime & her
daughter Margaret with her while she remains single
they are to have each & live to work for them while
they live together & Margaret is to have a negro girl
named Matt & her children when she leaves the place
I will to my son John a negro girl named Kelly,

I will to my son William a negro boy Chucky

I will to my son Denise a negro boy Isack -

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I will one negro boy Littleton to be divided equally
between my two sons John & Daniel, I will a negro
boy named Nelson to my son James, I will one negro
boy named to my two sons Robert & James to be shared
& Robert to pay half the value to James Caldwell
and keep him all. I will one negro boy named Dick
to my son Silas, I will a negro girl named back to him
with its mother while my widow lives & then to be sold
with its mother & back & equally divided amongst
all my children. I will to my son Robert a negro girl
named as Hester, ~~the~~ my beloved wife. Two cows
her pick, and to Margaret one her bairding. Her third
pick, I will to my daughter Margaret all her brass
and beads & clothes that she has made about seven
more also two hundred dollars, I will my wife
two horses named to all the other beily also a bairry
waggon, I will to my daughter Margaret one
hundred & fifty acres of land joining the pine hill if
she dies with out said heirs then said land to be equ
divided between John & James Caldwell's eldest son
also a four wheeled new one put over from the back all
to be owned, I will to my son Silas two horses and to
William one, all these horses and the kitchen garden
to remain another plantation for the use of my wife
during her life & then to be equally divided amongst
my heirs. my waggon to remain as a plantation
for the use of my family, my little waggon to be sold
Lastly I appoint John & Robert Caldwell my Executors
of this my last will & Testament. In witness where of
I hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this 3^d day
of November in the year of our Lord 1852
