my small white & large black 5th I give & bequeath to my
grand Daughter Martha Latham my bed & linen.

6th I give and bequeath unto my three grand Daughters
Martha Latham Infant Latham and Susan Latham all the
effects of my estate not mentioned herein—

7th I do hereby constitute Adam and appoint my beloved son
in law Sam Latham & my friend Henry Shapley Executors
to this my last will & testament hereby making
and ratifying all former by me made ratifying this
and no other to be my last will & testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
affixed my seal this 13th day of Feb^r 1835 and
at the Independence of the United States 19th

And the Fifty Dollars willow to James Craig is to
remain in the hands of Sam Latham for two years
and if not called for by proper authority in the two
years the money is to go to Sam Latham & his Heirs

In the first place I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Margaret our grey & black head bed & furniture
and three year & a half annuity of the remainder of the
price of Land in Barwick bannock and her household furniture
and all the grain that is now and the rest of the land
in lifetime - I give & bequeath to my well beloved
daughter Janet our silver & gold that goes by her own
I give & bequeath to my wife Margaret & daughter
Mary our barrow and cart or the value thereof - and
the remainder to be equally divided among my four
daughters - I do hereby constitute my well beloved
wife and my son in Law Ralph Hunter of this my
Last will & Testament, And I do utterly deny & disown
null all other former wills & Testaments of this my
and no other to be my Last will & Testament in
any, whereof I have made do my hand and seal the
day & year first above written
