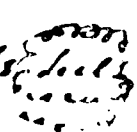


Robert Danks to execute & settle my estate in the manner

1822 - signed sealed & delivered

The Revocation Will of Richard Danks declared to the  
Subscribing witnesses on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1823  
1<sup>st</sup> It is my will & desire that one hundred Dollars be deducted from the  
note of hand in my possession given by my ~~brother~~ brother, Washington  
Danks which said one hundred dollars I give to my said brother  
for his own proper use. — 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my sister Mary Danks  
my negro girl & any new at my father's in, her that I possess  
3<sup>rd</sup> I desire that my under named executor as soon as money  
can be collected from my estate pay all my last debts. —  
4<sup>th</sup> After the above legacies & my debts are satisfied the bal-  
ance due on the note now in my possession together with  
eight Dollars & fifty cents due on account by Ephraim  
Hendrick with any thing else which may belong to me  
I give & bequeath to my beloved Brother William Danks  
for his friendly services to me in my present illness to him  
and his heirs forever.  
5<sup>th</sup> I appoint my brother William Danks my only  
executor to this my last will in presence of  
Stephen Fox  
Eph<sup>m</sup> Hendrick } who present & will witness

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Dunn being weak in body but  
of sound memory blessed be God. I do this first day of November  
in the year of our Lord 1824 make & publish this my last Will &  
testament in the following manner that is to say first I do give  
to my loving wife Ann Dunn the part of the land that they live  
on during her life a widowhood then to my son Robert Dunn

with the meadow to him or his heirs, Also I do give to my son Andrew  
Dunn the part of the plantation that he lives on; Also I do give to  
my son William Dunn the part of the plantation he lives on.  
Also I do give to my son James Dunn the part of the plantation that  
he lives on; - Also I do give to my daughter Abby one horse & saddle  
& one cow and bed & furniture. Also I do give to my Daughter Polly  
one horse & saddle & one cow & bed & furniture, the negro man to be  
left on the plantation to take care of the widow & the daughters  
during the widows life and then said negro man with the  
rest of the property to be sold & divided amongst the heirs.  
And I leave James Todd as Executor of this my will in trust for the  
intent & purposes in this my will contained in witness whereof I  
the said Robert Dunn have set my last will & Testament, set my  
hand & seal the day & year above written

In the name of God Amen, I Daniel Deherty of the State of North  
Carolina & County of Newhambury, being in health & sound mind  
& memory, and calling to mind that it is appointed, for all men once to  
die & after death the judgment when we are to render an account to  
Almighty God for all the deeds done in the body therefore I do  
make appoint & order this my last will & Testament; And first  
I give my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and leave my body  
to be buried at the discretion of my Executors in the fall uprisings  
of receiving the same again at the Resurrection of the last day.  
And of the property & good things of this life, I leave & bequeath in  
the following manner - First I will that all my lawful debts  
be paid in a convenient time after my death; - Second I will  
my Household furniture to my unmarried Daughters Elizabeth  
& Elanor, I leave & bequeath with my house & the rest end of my  
plantation to make a living on as long as the remain single  
or desirous to live on it; - Third I will my Daughters the use  
of the negroes, for the term of one year & farming utensils & all  
the same to be equally divided by a
