I Robert Elliott of the County of Rockingham in the State of
North Carolina (farmer) being weak in body but perfectly sound
in mind & memory do make & ordain the following & no other
to be my last will and testament.

1st This my will I desire that all my just debts shall be paid out of
my estate: — 2d. I will & bequeath to my wife Martha my
negro woman Cheney & hersey direct that a sum of the price
of eighty Dollars be purchased out of my estate which may with
her saddle & trills & one feather. do & provide I also be
queath to my said wife — 3d. It is my will that the plan-
tation on which I live shall be sold at publick sale to the highest
bidder and that part of the price thereof be applied to purchasing
one or less value for my wife & family to live upon which
shall be for the use of my family generally during the time
they live together, and I do hereby authorize & empower my
executors herein named to make a sufficient title in fee
simple for my said plantation to the purchaser of all the
right title & interest I have in the same.

4th I claim that my boy tell all the small negroes all my
stock of cattle hogs & sheep be kept for the use of my family
& that the residue of my horses & such articles as can be spared
from the family use be sold, I desire that my wife & family
live together during her widowhood and at the time my oldest
child comes of age that a distribution of all the estate then on
hand & not herein before mentioned shall be divided as equal as posse-
ble between & among my wife & all my children. I request my
children be educated in reading & writing & figure as far as the
use of three, and that the boys at a proper age be bound by
apprentices to learn genteel trades.
and I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife executrix

Escoffier and James Comer & George Graham Executors of
This my last Will & Testament and do hereby ratify & confirm
This & no other to be my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof
I the said Robert Elliott have hereunto set my hand &
Seal this 13th day of October 1805.

On the 20th of March in the year of our Lord 1812 Harry Emerson
late of Charlotte Mecklenburg County & Carolina Being in a
very low weak state of body but of sound mind & memory, sent
for & called Doctor Thomas Henderson, William Carson, William
Allison Esq^t, and William Allison Sen^r who being all present
did then & there in the presence & hearing of us the above named
doctor & say that his object in calling us was that he the said
Harry Emerson just had made no' ill. that he gave the
whole of his property to his wife except two negro boys who
he gave to his brother Billy Emerson being asked by Dr^r
Thomas Henderson the names of the two negro boys, he said he
left his two negro boys one named Harry & the other named
Ben to his brother Billy Emerson, and all his other property
to his wife & not a shilling to any other person, which he
directed us or some of us to commit to writing within the
time specified by law.

of March 1812.
