hereafter be given by any of the above named legatees for any pur-  
pose at a certain valuation or money as part of my Estate be  
considered & accounted as proceed of sale & division made accord-  
ingly Disallowing all former Wills, Legacies & Executives, Ordaining  
& allowing by these presents my beloved wife Priscilla with my sons  
Alexander B. Fenton & Francis Beck to be my joint Executrix of  
this my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have unto  
set my hand & seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our  
Lord 1826.
