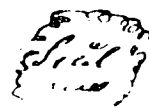

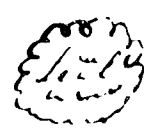

the mutability of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die; Do make & declare this my last will & Testament, in

with it hath pleased God to bless me within this life with
I give & dispose of the same in manner & form following to wit.
Item my will is that my Just debts should be paid; Also my will
is that my land & all my property be exposed to sale by my Ex^{rs}
as soon as convenient after my decease & the money arising
therefrom I leave to my son Jonathan Liggett to be paid to him
when he arrives of age by my Executors hereafter named and
furthermore. I do hereby constitute and appoint my worthy
friends James Liggett & George Leary my Executors to this my
last will & Testament, Ratifying & confirming this to be my
last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 10th day of July in the year of our
Lord 1816 in the presence of us The Subscribing witnesses

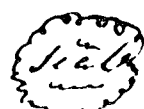
23 In the name of God Amen, I Robert Lemmond being weak of body
but of perfect sound mind & memory calling to mind the mutability
& approaching dissolution of my body, knowing that it is appointed
unto all men once to die; Do make & declare this my last will &
Testament, and first I recommend my soul into the hands of God
that give it, & my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent
Christian manner at the discretion of my after named friends
And touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to

bless me with I dispose of in the following manner & from
 after all my last debts are paid. Myself. I will give & bequeath
 unto my beloved wife Jane Simmonds one bed & furniture her
 ready clothes & spinning wheel, together with the household
 & kitchen furniture, that is the one third of said furniture
 also the stock of cattle for the use & benefit of the family & one
 third of the plantation that I now live on which she remains my
 widow also one way horse for the use & benefit of the family
Item. I will give & bequeath unto my beloved son, James Simmonds
 William Simmonds, John Simmonds, Robert Simmonds & my
 daughter Elizabeth Simmonds, now Elizabeth Garrison the
 sum of one dollar & fifty cents each; Item. I will give & bequeath
 unto my two daughters Anna Simmonds & Mary Simmonds
 the sum of Twenty Dollars each to be paid by my two sons
 Cyrus & Charles Simmonds from any lands out of the
 profits arising to them from my land that I now live on
Item. I give bequeath & set over unto my two sons Cyrus
 Simmonds & Charles Simmonds all the plantation that I now
 live on, to be equally divided between them as they can agree
 or think best for their advantage to them their heirs & assigns
 forever. And Lastly I do hereby revoke, constitute &
 appoint my Trusty friend John M. Robinson to be my whole
 & sole executor of this my last will & Testament, and I do
 hereby set aside all other wills Legacies or bequeathments by
 me heretofore made or intended to be made, hereby Ratifying
 & confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
 4th day of December 1817-
