23 In the name of God Amen, I Robert Lemmond being weak of body  
but of perfect sound mind & memory calling to mind the mortality  
& approaching dissolution of my body, knowing that it is appointed  
unto all men to die; Do make & declare this my last will &

that give it, & my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent  
Christian manner at the discretion of my after named Executors

Item. I will give & bequeath unto my beloved sons, James Semmons  
 William Semmons, John Semmons, Robert Semmons & my  
 daughter Elizabeth Semmons, now Elizabeth Garrison the  
 sum of one hundred & fifty dollars each; Item. I will give & bequeath  
 unto my two daughters Anna Semmons & Nancy Semmons  
 the sum of Twenty Dollars each to be paid by my two sons  
 Cyrus & Mars Semmons from my hands out of the  
 benefits arising to them from my land that I now live on  
Item. I give bequeath & set over unto my two sons Cyrus  
 Semmons & Mars Semmons all the plantation that I now  
 live on to be equally divided between them as they can agree  
 or think best for their advantage to them their heirs or assigns  
 forever. And Lastly I do hereby reconstitute &  
 appoint my Trusty friend John M. Robinson to be my whole  
 sole executor of this my last will & Testament, and I do  
 hereby set aside all other wills Legacies or Bequeathments by  
 me heretofore made or intended to be made, hereby Ratifying  
 & confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament
