In the name of God Amen I Robert M'Clennan of Kirkaldy County
in the province of Scotland subscriber to this my last will & Testament do make &
my thoughts be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my
body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I make
this my last will & Testament that is to say principally &
first of all I give my soul unto the hands of God that gave it, &
my body to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the
direction of my Executors, and as for such worldly goods as it
hath pleased God to let me have in this life, I give my executors
the disposal of in the following manner - Beginning with my debts,
Debt to be fairly paid, then I give £1000 & the rest to my wife
Isabella wife Elizabeth M'Clennan the most excellent & dearest
woman living with all the improvements therein excepting one
household poor except the upper end which is to be kept property
during life yet her death at the expense of only not far to go from
my children, I have the choice often made up provided also the
house & furniture belonging thereto then I give £1000 & the rest
my household & cattle & fowls & fowl house & garden & the above described
house & land to kick into remaining part of the Trust
now living on, I believe the time passing made better known to be
her property, also over further back the same time then I give a 1/3
of my estate unto my brother Alexander Finlay M'Clennan the party
to whom I have bequeathed my house & garden & land by
my will before named upon him M'Clennan my son of land by
my wife Elizabeth M'Clennan for which I pay off the patent money entitling
him to his houses name, with the part of the Trust which has formerly
belonged to him... And all the remainder of my estate which
equally divided amongst the children together I constitute
a Capital sum to be applied my last bequest wife Elizabeth M'Clennan having
last will & Testament and do hereby revoke all other his
& Testaments by me herebefore made, as also those my husband

In the Name of God Amen, This 13th day of May 1769 I Joseph Moore
of Rockingham County being very sick & weak in body, but of the full
mind & memory thank be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the
Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die. Now make & declare this my last will & testament, that is to say
Principally & first of all I give & command my soul unto the hand of
almighty God that I leave at my body & command to be cast to the
buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors
nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly
estate as hereinafter it has pleased God to bestow in this life I give & command
the same in the following manner & form. First I give &
bequeath the sum one hundred dollars to my wife to have her maintenance
out of which I now have no present, Then choice of any of the best, that
she thinks proper as long as she lives & the rest I leave to my late beloved
son Joseph to take care of his mother while she is alive except one
lens & half. One lens I leave to my daughter Alice Lemon, Also to my
so my well beloved son whom I have constituted trustee & under
my sole Execution of this my last will & testament. And I do hereby utterly
disallow, Revise & disannul all & every other persons testament left,
before, beggars Executed by me in any wise before named, willed &
bequested. Ratifying & confirming this two others to be my last will &
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the
day & year above written. — Signed sealed published pronounced and
delivered to the said Joseph Moore as his last will & testament in the
presence of us the subscribers hereto present
