now line with all the improvements therein existing and  
her share across the upper end to which is to be her property  
during life & at her death at disposing only not for to go from  
my children, Situate in a choice of the best & fertile also the  
house & premises belonging thereto them I give & bequeath unto  
my well beloved daughter Jennet M. Clendenen the above except  
her share of land to which is the remaining part of the tract  
now line on, otherwise the two pieces of land to be  
her property, like one further land & premises them I give and  
bequeath unto my well beloved son Jimmy M. Clendenen the part of  
the stock which has passed in his name - them I give & bequeath  
unto my well beloved son John M. Clendenen one tract of land ly-  
ing near Broad river for which I paid for & the part of same cut in  
James & James name, in the part of the stock which has formerly  
been named to him - And all the remainder of my estate I leave  
personally at the discretion of my Executors & to be  
equally divided amongst the above legacies - I constitute  
& appoint my well beloved wife Elizabeth M. Clendenen  
Patton Esq. & John Crockett for to be sole Executors of this my  
last will & testament, And do hereby revoke all other wills  
& testaments by me heretofore made, as the words my last will  
& testament

of the Newbury County being very sick & weak in body, but of full  
mind & memory thanks be given unto God, therefore calling unto mind the  
mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to  
die, Do make & declare this my last Will & Testament, that is to say  
Principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of  
Almighty God that gave it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be  
buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors  
nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the  
same again by the mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly  
estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless in this life, I give, devise  
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form. First I give &  
bequeath the to Mary my dearly beloved wife to have her maintenance  
out of what I am now possessed, & her choice of any of the land, that  
she thinks proper as long as she lives & the rest I leave to my well beloved  
son Joseph Moore to take care of his mother while she is alive. Except one  
cow & calf & one ewe & lamb to my daughter Ann Lemow, Also to my  
to my well beloved son whom I likewise constitute make & order  
my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. And I do hereby utterly  
disallow, Revoke & disannul all & every other former Testament, Will,  
Bequest, bequest, Execution by me in any wise before named, Will &  
bequested, Making & confirming this & no other to be my last Will &

day & year above written. Signed sealed published pronounced and  
delivered to the said Joseph Moore as his last Will & Testament in the
