33 In the name of God Amen I Robert Moffet being weak of body but  
imperfect mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of my body, know-  
ing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make & beleave  
this my last will & testament, that is to say principally & first I  
recommend my soule to God who gave it, & my body to be buried in Christian  
manner at the discretion of my Executors, And as touching such worldly  
goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with & likewise of them in  
the following manner Imprimis I give & bequeath to my dearly be-  
loved beloved wife Martha Moffet all my land & inclosure on, & also I  
give to her one bay mare & all the two year old horse colt & also I give bed  
& furniture & all her other old things & also all the pewter & silver furniture  
with the pots & fire tongs & also her bed & also all her meat with the  
flour & the hulk of all sorts of grain & meadows in the ground at this  
instant also three head of Cows & calves & three head of Ewe & lambs two  
breeding sows & two bassons with her saddle & also I give &  
bequeath to William Moffet eldest son of John & Moffet deceased forty  
pounds like money of this province, & also his brother John Moffet  
forty pounds like money of this province, & also I give & bequeath to John  
Moffet youngest son of my brother John Moffet three hundred pounds like  
money one hundred of this money in ready like money of this province  
& also I give & bequeath to each of my brother John & Moffet's two daughters  
fifty pounds each one like money as aforesaid, also I give & bequeath to  
Martha Rogers second daughter of Joseph Rogers fifty pounds like  
money as aforesaid, These & if my sister will & pleasure to give to  
bequeath to my dearly beloved wife one of a linneth named Rose  
to be at her disposal, & also I allow the Medals to sell to be sold  
along with the rest of my movable estate not beilled nor mentioned  
any, & the money arising from the sale to pay off each legall due the  
money in hand & the surplus money to return to the widow  
& if this money should not be enough I beleave that shall be  
deducted out of each one's part according to each one's share.  
And I do hereby app. into my beloved wife Martha & Moffet

And my brethren saw Joseph Rogers to be my lawful & sole Executor  
of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all former be-  
quests & Legacies, Notifying & confirming that none other to be  
last will & Testament. Item I do appoint John Moffet son of  
David Moffet to be Executor over my brother John Moffet, sister  
Whisper Childress, and my Executors to have the care of my  
Estate sealed with my seal & dated this 14<sup>th</sup> day of April in  
the year of our Lord 1778 -

23 In the name of God Amen, I David Moore of the County of  
Mercklenburg, being very weak in body tho' of a sound and  
perfect understanding & memory, do constitute this my last will  
& Testament, that is to say principally & first of all give & recommend  
my soul to God, I order & appoint that my body should be buried  
decently at the discretion of my dear wife & Executors hereafter named  
As to my worldly Estate I dispose of the same in the following manner  
viz I will & positively order that my debts be paid, I give to my  
dear & loving wife the house where I live with all the furniture  
therein this 2<sup>d</sup> plantation, three working Creatures & three milch cows  
I appoint my son Joseph Moore & Hugh Moore to have my land equally  
divided between them, I appoint & specially bequeath with the con-  
sent & approbation of my wife Margaret Moore that Joseph Moore  
should have the place on which he lives & improves in part of said  
Division, I will that my son William Moore should have six pounds  
currency, I will that my son David Moore should have ten pounds currency  
I will that my Daughter Mary & Mary should have five shillings of the  
three acres on the plantation after my decease, I will that my dear  
changel'd Eliza should have ten shillings, and what shall remain  
in the hands of my Executors after the above portions are paid
