22 In the Name of God Omnipotent I Robert Houston of the County of Wickeley & State of Carolina Considering being in my ordinary health of body & of sound mind & memory thanks be to God therefor calling to mind the Mortality of my body & that it is appropriate for all men once to die, Do make & ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally first of all I give my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of my executors. And as touching such totally estate wherewithal I live. The pleasure God to bestow me in this life, I give & bequeath the sum in the following manner & form viz I give & bequeath unto Susannah Houston my beloved wife one third part of all my lands & other moving her material life & also one third part of my personal Estate. Item I give & bequeath unto Susannah Houston my Eldest son all that plantation tract or parcel of land on which I now live to him his heirs & assigns forever at Austin his now living domicile, provided that he the said Susannah Houston pay to my Execut. the sum of Fifty pounds per ann<sup>m</sup> money for the use of my other Legatees. Item I give & bequeath unto Asa Houston my third son the sum of five pounds. Item I give & bequeath unto Augustine Whaley my Eldest daughter the sum of Ten pounds for the use & benefit of her daughter Susannah. Item I give & bequeath unto Susannah & Hale my second Daughter the sum of Five pounds. Item I give & bequeath unto August Houston the sum of Five pounds. It is further my will & pleasure that after my just debts & those above mentioned legacies are paid & set off the remainder of my Estate be equally divided among my children. — And I do hereby constitute & appoint Asa Houston & James Bradburn to be my sole Executors of this my last will & Testament, to do hereby & ther by their selfs, & make & chian and do every other power testamentary herby given, & Executed by me in my now wised, willed or signified before making this my last will to be my last will & Testament. In the name of God amen I Robert Moffat being weak of body but  
 improved mind & memory calling to mind the Mortality of my body, knowing  
 that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make & declare  
 this my last will & Testament, that is to say principally & first I  
 recommend my soul to God who gave it, my body to be buried in Christian  
 manner at the discretion of my executors, and as summing such worldly  
 good as it hath pleased God to bestow me with, I dispose of the same in  
 the following manner. In primitus I give & bequeath to my dearest &  
 well beloved wife Martha Moffat all my land & tenement on, & also I  
 give to her my young mare black & a two year old horse colt & also I give her  
 & her children half the other colt living & also all the pasture & sheep sufficient  
 with the pot & fire tools & also her kitchen & also all house meat with the  
 floor & the half of all sorts of grain & meadow in the ground at their  
 instant also three head of cows & calves & three head of ewes & lambs two  
 breeding sows & two hares with her saddle &c also I give to  
 my son William Moffat eldest son of John Moffat deceased forty  
 pounds lawful money of this province, & also his brother John Moffat  
 forty pounds like money of this province, & also I give & bequeath to Robert  
 Moffat youngest son of my brother John Moffat three hundred pounds  
 money one hundred of this money in necessary like money of this province  
 & also I give & bequeath to each of my brothers John Moffat two thousand  
 fifty pounds cash one like money as he received, also I give him  
 Martha Rogers second daughter of Joseph Rogers fifty pounds like  
 money as aforesaid. Hoc is my further will & pleasure to give to  
 my nearly beloved wife Mrs Agnes Louisa named Rose  
 to be at her disposal, & also I allow the Medals & Pillars to be sold  
 along with the rest of my moveable estate not listed nor mentioned
