

To make this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
to wit: First I order all my lawful debts to be fully discharged
and paid. Then I Will & bequeath unto my well beloved wife Fanny
the one half of all my estate to her own use & behoof -
Then I also Will & bequeath unto my well beloved daughter
Mary the other h. of my estate to be put to interest till she
becomes of Age - and for the true Execution of this my last
Will & Testament I do choose & appoint my well beloved
son Jonathan Pennix to be whole & sole Executor of this
my last Will as witness my hand & seal this 19th of July 1793

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Phillips
of Hockhewery County State of N. Carolina, being in health of
body & sound mind & memory (blessed be God) but calling to mind
the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, Do make this 23rd day of August in the year of our Lord
1793 make & declare this my last Will & Testament in manner &
to the following Viz. My wishes I Give & bequeath my soul into
the hands of Almighty God to be governed, keeping for a gracious
acceptance thro' the merits of Jesus Christ my soul, & my
body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like &
decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter to be
named, unto my worldly goods whereunto it has pleased God to bless
I bless me with I dispose of in the following manner -
Item I desire is that after my decease all my last estate
be paid out of my estate by my hereafter named Executors -
Item I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Phillips (by way of
an annuity) a horse & saddle, a feather bed & furniture & 1/2 the
part of profits arising from the cultivation of the plantation where
I now live, & a house to live in during the term she shall live
in on the plantation & my negro girl back together with the best
part of the silver & kitchen furniture all clearing her in her life

in state of widowhood. Item I give & bequeath to my son William Phillips
a feather bed & furniture & a horse (either after my decease or before) & to
belong to him & his heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my daughter
Polly Phillips a horse & saddle a feather bed & furniture, and after the
decease or marriage of my beloved wife my negro girl back & one third
of the hit to her & dress & furniture & two cows & calves to belong to her
& her heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my son Robert Phillips
the plantation whereon I now live with its improvements after my decease
he giving his mother the fifth of the profits arising from it during
her natural life in widowhood & also two work horses, two pair of
geese & two plows, two wedding rings & a mattress, & an ox, a saddle
horse & saddle, a feather bed & furniture, six cows, a mowing machine
& cradle & the one half of the crop that may be in the ground or
harvested at the time of my decease to him & allow to support him
self & his wife & family I may leave with him, also my negro man
Sam, or if I should swap him for another, the one that I receive for
him, the whole of the above & one third of the crops & his home
furniture to belong to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Phillips the Social man now
his possession & a feather bed, land to my son George Phillips a feather
bed & three furnitures; and after all the above mentioned legacies
are paid off, then my will & desire is that all my other property
of every nature & kind not in this will mentioned or devised, I
allow & desire to be sold at public sale, & if it amounts to less
hundred pounds then to be equally divided between my two sons
John & George, & if it should amount to more, then that sum
then the surplus to be equally divided between my daughter

Polly & Robert Phillips the whole as in this devised to belong
to them & their heirs forever. Witness I do hereby nominate & appoint
my beloved wife executor & my sons William & Robert Phillips
executors of this my last will & testament, & I do hereby revoke
& make void all other wills & testaments by me heretofore made
& do ratify & confirm this & this alone to be my last will & testament
I witness my hand & seal hereunto annexed the 21st day of June
1771. Signed, sealed, published & shewed in the
