In witness, I do hereby constabularily declare & appoint my beloved wife Hannah Peoples & my beloved son Rich'd Peoples to be the whole & sole executors of this my last Will & Testament, & I do hereby utterly revoke & disown all other former Wills, Ratifying & confirming this to be my last Will & Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 28th day of January 1827 -

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Poole of the County of Rockingham State of North Carolina, being sick & in a low condition & perfectly sound in mind & memory blessed be God. Do this 15th day of July in the year of our Lord 1828 make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following That is to say it is my will that all my just & lawful debts be paid in such a manner as will be hereafter mentioned I bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Peoples the man named Clark & her child named Cheany my Negro man named Sam which at her death I do give to my son John, I also bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Peoples in her lifetime which I now live on & suppose to consist of one hundred & three acres which land I give her as aforesaid right to her to dispose of at her pleasure as she may think proper. I also give to my wife

Elizabeth third known & beloved of her choice of my Master of
Littleton house. Our bondswoman & maid of all work part of
all of my house. She did much to comfort us with all the
provisions for my wife & children when we had such
an excellent master. Her two children gave note to my beloved
James & Jane Pitts. Their names were registered also give to
my beloved ones. Robert Pitts & his wife Anna their children
made Robert to my beloved son & Anna Pitts my
dear birth name. I now leave the same to my beloved
eldest son. Robert Pitts the day of first which she has now
in preparing by the name of Pitts Anna. I do give & bequeath
to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Pitts my dearest girl name Jane
I also give & bequeath to my daughter Anna Pitts a this
third last estate of mine here Littleton farm in the 4th of
July the whole residue & property not herein especially
written to be left to the said Robert Pitts at a credit of
Twenty million dollars & the interest thereof & I do make it is
my command that all the account debts be paid & the one
to his credit. It is my command that he do it in my will
that it be done in the city of Boston and with Elizabeth &
Jane Pitts Anna & Robert Pitts & their descendants
constituted & appointed my heirs William & Davidson
& my wife Anna Pitts my executors to administer this my
last testamentary power to execute whereof I the said
Robert have to this my last will & Testament set my
hand & seal the day of the 4th of June written
