I Robert Sumnerville being sick of sense & memory, calling to remembrance the mortality of mankind & that it is allotted to man to die: & after some time of prayer, I give my soul to God that gave it, Next I allow my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors Next I allow all my worldly Debts to be honestly paid: Next I leave my worldly effects in manner following: First I leave my dear & loving wife the one fourth of all my effects after the debts is all paid & her Saddle & above & her living of the land while she remains a widow & at the end of her widowhood I allow the land to two boys William Sumnerville & Johnstone Sumnerville & my son William my Saddle & above. I allow my daughter Nancy Sumnerville a child part of the effect or lession of the Land & my son William to give her a good new Saddle if she lives to the years of Eighteen, I like my Children to be well schooled each of them out of the Brown Shury, I allow Joseph Moore Senr. & John Johnston to be my Executors & sole Executors, I do disannul & disallow & revoke all other Will or Wills heretofore made & this to be my last Will & Testament, I hereunto set my hand & seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of June 1796
