sound mind & memory thanks we give unto God & our Saviour,
to mind my Mortality & that it is appointed for all men once to die.
Do make this my last will & testament. First of commanding
my soul into the hand of the God that gave it, and my body to
the earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the deceas-
tion of my faculties hereafter known to me by dissolution, and to
receive the same again at the general Resurrection by
the mighty power of God acting through the merits, & in the
y. baptism of my Lord Jesus Christ. It is desired to receive a
full & full portion of all my dues & to inherit everlasting life
(And for nothing worth worthy tithe or titheth) blessed God to
so let me with in this life I give thanks, dispense & part with
in the following manner & form my first of all will that
all those debts &欠款 that I owe to any person or persons
either in Right or in Conscience be paid & satisfied as con-
cerned to be paid in convenient time by my Executrix here
after named.

I give & bequeath to my loving wife Eliza both her body & services
here & after dying with all the house hold furniture including all
effects of breeding with a sufficient maintenance in my chancery
house during her natural life with a bay horse & a bay mare
two cows of her own choosing & the rest to be disposed of by her as
others may here after, the Negroes to remain on the plantation for the use
& support of said family the labours of negroes taken I bequeath to my
wife during her life all above mentioned except the house
& Negroe to be disposed of by her as she thinks proper to her &
to an slave forever.

I give & bequeath to my son James my black Slave, a Bodied
boy and black breeder to have his time & signs forever

I give & bequeath to my son Richard my weeding hat my shirt

boat my Raft I sent thy coat to him & to his Husband
 to me I give & bequeath to my Daugther Jean one Cow & half of her
 Motters choosing to her & to her Husb, & issue
 them. I give & bequeath to my daughter Jean a very silly cow
 your old pair & one Cow are, two of me mothers choosing
 to her & to her Husb, & issue
 them. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth one Cow least
 of me mothers choosing to her & her Husb, & issue
 them. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary that piece or parcel
 of my land that interfaces with Thomas Walkers on condi-
 tion he the said Walker chooses to exchange as much other
 land it may want William Conner to take it, & I also
 give to her, & with the two other creatures of her mothers choosing
 to her & her Husb, & issue
 them. I give & bequeath to my Grandson William Conner at my
 request because my daughter, wife & plantation wherein
 I now live a bed & furniture thereunto belonging with all
 utensils of house & garden not in rot or decay mentioned with
 a new wagg on that is now & making including a say
 mire & boat, land it is my will & desire that upon Conner
 goes unto my son Samuel a horse or mule at the ripe
 seasons of three years which will be worth Thirty Dollars
 & many values by two indifferent men.
 them. I leave & bequeath to William Conner with all his
 mentioned my books to him & his heirs forever
 them. I make & nominate constable & appoint my Son
 and my Grandson William Conner executors of this
 my last will & Testament, hereby revoking & discharging all
 else former & other wills, bequests, legacies & Administrations
 by me in any wise made or bequeathed or done in this part
 of the world confirming this & no other to be my last will
 and Testament

give & bequeath to my wife one hundred pounds sterling covering
to her & to her Heirs, forever —

Item. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth our Cow beast
of our mothers choosing to her & her Heirs, forever —

Item. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary that piece or pieces
of my Land that interferes with Thomas Halkins or condi-
tion by the said Halkins agrees to exchange as much when
ever it may first will be convenient to take it, & I also
give & bequeath to her & her Heirs forever —

Item. I give & bequeath to my grandson William Conner at my
wifes Death my种植园, house & plantation wherein
I now live & also & in voluntary thereto belonging with all
it lands of her ownership not heretofore mentioned with
a new Waggon that is now being made including a six
miles & land, and it is my will & desire that she leave
give unto my son Samuel a horse or mule at the ex-

Item. I leave & bequeath to William Conner with all before
mentioned to my books to him & his Heirs, forever —

Item. I name nominate constitute & appoint my Son George
and my Grandson William Conner executors of this
my last will & Testament, hereby revoking & disannulling
all other wills, bequests, charters & instruments
by me in any wise so called bequeathed or diminished heretofore
I am desirous & confirming this & no other to be my last will
and Testament

Item. I leave & bequeath to my daughter Mary my Loom & Tools which now in her possession and to her Heirs forever —

Item. I give & bequeath to my Grandson William Conner Watch in consequence of his paying Thomas Harton one Guiney in Gold to his Horse for him. I give & bequeath to my son Samuel one horse to be levied out of my Estate as before mentioned in said Will and to his Heirs forever —

Item. I give & bequeath to William Conner two Lenes of his own growing and to his Heirs forever —

The above Prope will be received by all as a part of the last Will & Testament of Samuel Blythe though done at a different time in witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 22^d day of Feb 1793

To my Daughter Fanny the sum of five pounds —

To my Son John the sum of ten shillings to be deducted out of his note due
