Then I will & bequeath to my beloved son James Fair one dollar
in full of his share—Then I will & bequeath to my two daugh-
ters Margaret Rice & Hannah Fair all the residue of the estate
I may die possessed of all my Goods & Chattels, bonds notes Accounts
debts of every description of effects I may die possessed of or
that might or may be recovered in any Court of Law or Equity
for me or in my name or on my account there & there alike
constituting them their Heirs & assigns the whole & sole Heirs
of my estate after discharging my first debts & the above beque-
-athments— I hereby constitute nominate & appoint
my friends William Beane & Joseph Withers and
to be my Executors to this my last will & Testament, I hereby
declaring, publishing & pronouncing this to be my last &
only will, Revoking & annulling all others. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 25th day of Apr. 1806
