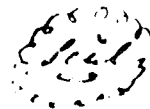

I now being about to start on my Circuits & as you have my Will in keeping which I cannot have access in, to make the alterations hereafter mentioned I send you this to be kept safe as a part of my Will or a codicil thereto & is as follows Whereas I have sold the land to John Dowe which I devised to my son Samuel & my three eldest daughters as therein mentioned, & such sale being a revocation of so much of my said Will I devise the Six thousand five hundred dollars for which I sold my land as follows, eight hundred dollars of it to my three eldest daughters, six hundred dollars to Mary Jack Lewis, six hundred dollars to my daughter Elizabeth Mary Lewis & six hundred dollars to my daughter Peggy Alexander Lewis to be placed out by my Executors for them untill the day of their several Marriages or untill as each arrives at thirty years of age when the money is to be paid to each of them. The money to be well secured when loaned to the interest annually paid to each of them equally, the balance to be placed at interest for my son Samuel by the same my said three thousand seven hundred dollars & him to be supported & educated out of the interest, & the surplus interest if any to accumulate & when the opportunity offers the whole to be laid out in a purchase of a tract of Land for my said son Samuel to him at death time as my Executors may in their discretion think will be most for his interest having regard to his support and education.
