 & State of Massachusetts, being, for comfort in life & reflecting that death
 may not be far distant, Do declare & declare that to be my last will & testa-
 ment First That my body be committed to the earth in a decent and
 Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
 appointed, and as to my worldly estate it is my will that the following
 disposition should be effect after my death, 1st I will I bequeath
 all my estate real & personal to my beloved wife Deborah McLeary
 to have use & possess as she may think proper during her life or widow
 here together with an absolute property in her house & stable my bed
 & the furniture of my house & the furniture which latter I will to
 her & her sole disposal. 2^d I will I bequeath to my nephew Samuel
 McLeary son of my deceased brother Robert McLeary my negro woman
 Anne Hannah to take into his possession at the decease of my wife
 Deborah McLeary together with her present situation upon except as here
 in after excepted. 3^d I will I bequeath to my nephew Samuel
 McLeary brother son of my late Hannah Beane my negro man Simon
 to take into his possession at the decease of my wife Deborah McLeary
4th I desire to my brother in law Ebenezer Peck an hundred acres of land
 lying in the Indian territory on the banks of Duck river it being part
 of a survey of six hundred acres. 5th I give & desire to my nephews
 Andrew McLeary & James McLeary sons of my deceased brother Robert
 McLeary all the residue of said tract after the decease of my wife De-
 borah McLeary. 6th It is my will that at the decease of my wife Deborah McLeary
 all the residue of my property not herein specially bequeathed shall
 be sold by my Executors & distributed in three equal shares my son
 Hannah Beane, my nephew Andrew McLeary & my nephew James McLeary
7th It is my will that my Negro Girl Daphne child of Hannah should at
 the decease of my wife be committed to the Guardianship & care of my
 nephew Samuel McLeary until she arrives to the age of eighteen years
 at which time it is my will that she should be free & I enjoin it upon
 my said nephew together with my executors to use all necessary in-
 fluence to obtain the freedom of said negro girl from the proper
 authorities, And if her freedom should not be procured, still that she
 should be under the perpetual Guardianship & tutelage of the said
 nephew & his executors & that he should use as much

Christian to be my man at the direction of my Executors hereafter
appointed, and as to my worldly Estate it is my will that the following
disposition should take effect after my death. 1st I will & bequeath
all my Estate Real & personal to my beloved wife Deborah McLeary
to have use & possess as she may think proper during her life or widow
hood to go therewith an absolute property in her house & garden my bed
& the contents of my house & furniture, furniture to which latter I will to
me & to her sole disposal. 2nd I will & bequeath to my Nephew Samuel
McLeary son of my deceased brother Robert McLeary my negro woman
Hannah to take into his possession at the decease of my wife
& Deborah McLeary together with her personal effects upon Execution here
in after excepted. 3rd I will & bequeath to my Nephew Samuel
McLeary Grandson of my late Hannah Beane my negro man Stuart
to take into his possession at the decease of my wife Deborah McLeary
4th I bequeath to my brother-in-law Enoch Polk an hundred acres of land
lying in the Indian Territory on the banks of Duck river it being part
of a Survey of six hundred acres. 5th I give & bequeath to my nephews
Andrew McLeary & James McLeary sons of my deceased brother Robert
McLeary all the residue of said tract after the decease of my wife Deborah
McLeary. 6th It is my will that at the decease of my wife Deborah McLeary
all the residue of my property not herein specially bequeathed shall
be sold by my Executors & distributed in three equal shares my son
Hannah Beane, my Nephew to have McLeary & my Nephew Samuel McLeary
7th It is my will that my Negro Girl Daphne child of Hannah should at
the decease of my wife be committed to the Guardianship & care of my
Nephew Samuel McLeary until she arrives to the age of eighteen years
at which time it is my will that she should be free & I enjoin it upon
my said Nephew to give her with my remainder to use all necessary in
deed to obtain the freedom of said Negro Girl from the proper
authorities. But if her freedom should not be procured, she shall then
remain under the perpetual Guardianship & tutelage of the said
Samuel McLeary not as a Slave but that he allow her as much liberty
as may be found consistent with her own good. It is also my will
that the said Negro Girl be not separated to read before the decease
of my wife my Executors should pay the said Samuel McLeary the
sum of \$1000 to be raised out of any part of my Estate to be by him applied

... And lastly I do hereby certify & confirm this as my
& testament, revoking & entirely annulling all others, and do hereby
testify & declare my trusty friends Hugh Parks & Hugh Harris Executors of
my last will & testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and my seal this 8th day of August in the year of our Lord 1797

State of New Jersey being at present sick in body but a disposing manner
before God, and calling to mind the mortality of the body & that it is
appointed for all men once to die, Do make & declare this my last will &
testament in the manner & form following Viz First of all I recommend
my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried in
Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors herein
named to be done in this life, I give & dispose of the same as follows
First I give that my last estate & personal expenses be paid & discharged
as soon as convenient after my decease. My friends I give & bequeath
unto my loved beloved wife Fanny the one third part of all my lands
lying on the east side of King's Creek & the described house & new lie in
to be with the best buildings thereunto belonging, & that to her own
use during her natural life & to have the sole managing use & profits of the
land, stock of cattle, sheep & hogs, plantation, tools & utensils, household
furniture & all that during the time she remains my widow, for
the use of raising, supporting & bringing up my children, and if it so
happens that my widow do at any time marry, then such of the last
mentioned property as shall then be found in being to be equal to part
with the new lie & house & my late youngest daughter, my love of my
my wife my youngest son & my late youngest daughter, & the balance to
be my wife & my son & daughter but I bequeath my love of my
some of the choice of my farm with its improvements to be
unto my son James that part of my land
