I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent  
Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors  
nothing doubting at the General Resurrection  
I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
Power of God, and as touching my worldly  
estate where with it has pleased God to bless  
me in this life I give devise & dispose of the  
note of hand that lyeth with Willmon Terry &  
Fifty Three pounds fifteen shillings Virginia money  
& likewise a bond of one hundred & eighty pounds  
Virginia money & three years interest upon Col.  
John Clark, & all book debts to be equally  
divided to my son John Wilkins & son at law  
Wilkins & John Anderson & likewise one fine  
old Catt unto Jack Wilkins Branded SW-  
& one black stallion Catt Branded SW unto John Anderson,  
and likewise I give further to my son  
Jonathan Wilkins my blue suit of clothes, great  
coat, shoes stockings, and to my cousin Samuel  
Wilkins I do give one bay horse branded 78 &  
likewise two mares & one horse the Brown mare  
branded R T & the brown mare branded with a swive  
Horse & SW & the bay horse branded SW. And all  
my other Mortalities that is at John Wilkins,

To be had & equally divided between John Wilkins  
 & son William Wilkins & joint distribution, and I do hereby  
 utterly disallow & revoke, disannul all & every other  
 former Testaments, Wills & Legacies whatsoever. In  
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal  
 this the 2<sup>d</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord 1763  
 signed, sealed, published & pronounced & declared  
 by the said Samuel Wilkins at his last will &  
 Testament in the presence of us who in his  
 presence & in the presence of each other have  
 hereunto subscribed our names -

 in the year of our Lord 1771 I William Reddington of the  
 County of Middlesex, being sick & weak,  
 in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given  
 to God. Thereon calling to mind the mortality of my  
 body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once  
 to die. Do make & ordain this to be my last will &  
 Testament, that is to say principally & first I give & do  
 recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave  
 it; & as for my body I recommend it to the earth to be  
 buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the  
 discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at  
 the general Resurrection I shall receive the same be  
 gain by the mighty power of God, and as touching  
 such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased  
 God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of  
 the same in the following manner & form -  
Imprimis I leave the whole disposing & management  
 of my Estate in my wife Elizabeth her hand hoping in
