& five sheep & one yoke of oxen I laid off all of these to be sold
at her death or marriage to be sold except the black cattle & 300
head of hogs, furniture, family effects & personal property to my two daughters
Sarah Kelly & Elizabeth Cowan at the sum limited given for their
division, also at the death or marriage of my daughters either
one or both equally divided between my two daughters the black cattle
