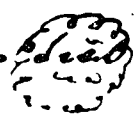


following manner I mean to will fifty pounds a piece to my son

able by my Executors — And I do hereby appoint my father in law
Alexander Ferguson & Robert Irwin my brother my whole & sole
Executors of this my last Will & Testament. And I make my loving
friend Benjamin Patton Executor of my last Will to take care
& see the same performed according to my true intent & meaning
I do hereby revoke & disannul all other former Wills &
Testaments, In Witness whereof I have to this my last Will and
Testament set my hand & Seal this 15th day of May in the year of
our Lord 1783 — Sealed, Published, & declared by the
above named William Irwin for & as my last Will &
Testament in presence of us.

22 In the name of God Amen, I Shadrach Jackson considering
the mortality of my body & that it is appointed unto men once
to die & after this the Judgment, being very sick & lame but enjoying
my perfect sense & memory — I do Give & bequeath unto my loving
wife one bed & furniture on Dunn Cove & half one red brindle
Horse on Round Bay keeping the fourth part of the money
of her father's Estate that is now in the hands of Alexander
Porter, also the brown horse Dick also the whole household
furniture, except two beds, also one saddle & bridle, also a
plow & all gears belonging to it, one Cox, three Axes, also
a black mare & colt, also one sow & three & two barrows,
also a black & white cow & the bell that she has one now
also one musket gun also the notes that is due now
from John Barnett the sum of Twenty five pounds Ten
Shillings, another Cox, &c. this I give unto her after
her widowhood & if she sees cause to marry a child
past after wards — I also give unto my son Charles

one Dun mare, one piddle Cow & piddle Yearling one bed & blanket one shot gun, one coat jacket & breeches. I also give to my son Richard the Dun mare colt, one red Cow & calf, one pole cow one killing horse one bed & blanket one shot gun after the other property is sold & the debt paid up then if any over plus it is to go to said Richard.

Also the Linnen & Yeards I give to my wife, also I do have two guns, one coat sword, two rings, two clips, & hand saw & a drawing knife, one brown horse, one saddle & bridle, two shoes & shoes & all other articles not mentioned & listed to be sold to pay my Tansel Debt all this of my own free will & record I freely do in witness whereunto I have set my hand & seal this 15th day of June 1745.

Also Thompson Hargrove & my wife below I appoint as Executors to my Estate

In the Name of God Amen. I Patrick Jack being of sound mind & memory. Do make my last Will & bequeath my Estate in the following manner— I do will my whole personal Estate to my beloved wife my Goods & Chattels, also the reasonable benefit of my House & Lots while she live & I do bequeath unto her, After her death the House & Lots are to be sold & the price thereof divided among five persons viz my, son Ensigns Mary Alexander, Margaret Wilson, Charity Dyson, Jane Barnett & Lylly Nicholson the fifth is my Grandson Patrick Jack each of these now named to receive an equal share of the money arising from the sale of the premises House & Lots— I do now constitute & appoint James Jack & Joseph Nicholson to be my Executors trusting they will see this last Will & Testament of mine precisely executed— I do now disannul & make void all former wills whosoever made have been made by me. Witness my hand & seal this 19th day of May in the Year of our Lord 1780
