 State of N Carolina being of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed
 be God, do this 25th day of February in the year of our Lord 1800
 make & publish this my last will & testament in manner follow-
 ing that is to say, I give & bequeath to my loving wife Jessie
 the House I now live in & all my other out houses & all the part
 of my plantation I now live on lying on the East side of the
 Creek together with nineteen acres on the west side of the Creek
 to be laid off on both sides of the middle ford to her only use &
 behoof during her natural life & at her decease to be sold by
 my Executors & the money there arising to be equally divided
 between my two youngest Daughters Mary & Jane, I likewise
 give & bequeath to my wife one Sorel Horse & her saddle & bridle
 one bed & furniture all her body clothes, all my farming & house
 hold & all my household furniture except what I may hereafter
 dispose of also one cow & calf & all my stock of sheep & hogs
 to her own use & behoof forever, I give & bequeath to my three
 Sons John, Robert & William & my Daughter Sarah Mason
 each Ten Dollars & to my son Thomas Twenty dollars, I
 likewise bequeath to my sons in law William & James
Stewart & my daughter in law Mary & Stephens Ston
 each Ten Dollars, I also bequeath to my daughter in law
Elizabeth her bed & furniture, three cows & two calves &
 two year old Heifers Ten dollars her saddle & bridle & all her
 body clothes to her only behoof & use forever, All the rest of my
 Land I will to be sold by my Executors & the money there
 arising after all lawful debts & general charges are paid to be
 equally divided between my two youngest daughters Mary
 & Jane I also give to my Daughter Mary one cow & a three
 year old Heifer one bed & furniture & all her body clothes
 & to my Daughter Jane one cow & calf, one bed & furniture
 & all her body clothes to their only use & behoof forever
 And I hereby make & declare my worthy friend Will^m. Morrison
 Esq. & my friend M^r. John Thompson Esq. Executors of this my last
 will & testament In witness whereof I the said William Smith
 have to this my last will & testament, set my hand & seal
 this day & year, in presence of

 sick & weak of body but of perfect sound mind & memory but call
 to mind my mortality & that it is appointed for man to die, Do this
 28th day of March 1806 make this my last will & Testament
 in manner & form following Viz. And first I will that all my
 Just Debts be honestly paid by my Executors herein after named
 and I bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret all the household
 Draper & Kitchen furniture & my Negro Girl Hannah & what
 money I have in hand & what is owing to me to be at her own
 disposal, also my black mare & all my neat Cattle hogs & sheep
 with her saddle & wheel, and to her full possession of this my
 Mansion house & to have a gentle living of my farm & to have
 the whole profits arising from the same during her widowhood
 with the farming utensils & what grain & meet is on hand at
 present. And to my nephew, Robert Sloan son John Sloan
 I bequeath Fifty Acres of Land, joining the land his father
 lives on to begin at my lower corner on the bank of the river
 & to run up the river as far as will make the said fifty acre
 square across the lower end of my land to him & his heirs
 And to William Bigham son of William Bigham of Lincoln
 County that now lives & has lived with me for some time
 past I bequeath all the remainder of the tract of Land where
 I now live be it more or less not to have it or molest my
 widow during her widowhood, also my gray mare
 known by the name of his Brown & saddle that is his own
 & saddle to him & his heirs forever And to Mr. Bease
