22 In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Cole, being weakly in body but
 of perfect mind & memory Thanks be unto God, letting unto mind the
 mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
 die; Do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament, That I do hereby principally
 & first of all I Give & recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty
 God that gave it & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
 in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors
 nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall receive
 the same again by the mighty power of God— And as touching
 such worldly estate whereunto it is pleased God to bless me with
 in this life, I Give & devise & dispose of the same in the following
 manner & form, That I do hereby will all my last estate to be paid first
 2^d I Give & bequeath all my Estate together with my household goods debts & any
 manors & profits to my beloved Mother Elizabeth Bayley as she shall think
 with as she thinks proper— 3^d I Give & bequeath to my dear friend
 Smith my Executor of this my last Will & Testament, Given under my hand
 & seal this the 3rd day of January in the Year of our Lord 1820.
