23 In the name of God amen. The 8th day of February 1776 I Thomas
Knighton of the County of Middlesex Province of New England
Plante, being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be to God, therefore calling to mind the mortality
of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make & declare this my last will & Testament. That is to say
principally & first of all, I give & command my soul unto the
hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I command to be
the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God.
And as touching such worldly estate herein with it hath pleased
God to bless me with in this life, I give & devise & dispose of the
following manner & form. Provision I give & command unto my
loving wife Elizabeth my whole Estate of Land, goods & chattels whatsoever
I have or shall have to be divided equally between my three Sons
John, Thomas & William. And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke
abandon all former other former Testament, Ratifying & confirming
this to be my last will & Testament, In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written
Signed before, published pronounced & witnessed by the P Thomas Knighton who last
wrote his Testament in the presence of us the subscribers
the 2^d day of Feb: 1776. At New Bedford
