of body and by the mercy of god
of sound & disposing mind and memory do
make & ordain this my last will & testament
in manner & form following (A'D)

where I command my soul to god who gave it & my
body to the grave to be buried at the discretion
of my executors herein after named
Item 1^o to the property where with god has been
pleased to bless me I will & dispose of it as follows
it shall & direct that all my just debts to be paid
out of my estate.

Item I will & bequeath my gold mine running from a
y^t to a y^t 48 Dredge except my plantation &
commencing on Dredge plough line and extending
to Edwards River Line including all the gold
including all the gold that may within
fifty rods on each side of plough line be
gathered with appropriate timber so may be
necessary for working the same in making

that my work the men and such timber
to be cut as near to the mine as to run
bright and when five acres to be cut for
use of the water of the gold mine known
to my beloved wife Mary, lives to my
daughter Jane Hartness and Matthew M.
Stewart and to my Son Robert Lewis Et
Lewis and Thomas Hartness Lewis among others
Mary, Jane Lewis to them & theirs forever
to have & to hold the said gold mine &
the ridge on which it stands common
intestate and no executors to enjoy all the prop
and proceed of said mine. To be equally divided
by my above named wife and seven children
share & have alike and each of the said
holders having an equal interest in said
mine shall bear an equal part in the
necessary expenses included in making up
the mine and shall furnish an equal amount
of the labour

then ^{by} the quantity of labour to be employed on
the mine and amount of expense, the costs
be incurred

in working said mine shall be so matched and
no more than shall be agreed to under
dictation or by two thirds of the above named
joint holders and owners of said mine
However one of the above named joint holders and owners
of the said mine shall be at liberty to
cause sell or banish his or her interest in the
said mine unless by the consent and apodolizing
of all the other joint heirs and owners

Mr. Jewell & bequeath to my beloved wife - Many lands
as her choice of my lands, The dwelling house in
which I now live with all the improvements and
appurtenances therewith and that her said house
including the same shall be held of from my
other land by lines as follows viz beginning at
a pine corner near the road leading from
David Phelps to the wagon road and running
thence across the creek to the mouth of
the Spring brook out of which she formerly
used (and leaving in said ditch the out of
which I never use) thence crooking the branch
in the field next my son Roberts at the mouth
of a spring brook thence up the hollow of
said brook to the fence next my son Roberts
Hines out side the fence to David Phelps
line to have and to hold and enjoy all
the benefits and proceeds of and answer during
the term of her natural life

Mr. Jewell & bequeath to my beloved wife as the bed
and bedding now in the house to be hers at
her own disposal and my cupboard closet
& beam near to be hers during the term of
her natural life or as long as she remains
my widow.

Mr. Jewell & bequeath to my beloved wife two cows
and to take her choice of the stalk one horse
black worth fifty dollars and her saddle
& bridle. and one year provision and her
utensil & cards also my cupboard & table
furniture

Mr. Jewell & bequeath to my son Robert Hines
a place of land agreeing his own land

169 In the S.W. to be laid off my other land
by a line beginning at a post oak tree up
downer and running in a straight line to
white oak to a white oak on the creek my
corner and also David Philips corner which
piece of land shall be divided by the wire by two
distinct men and he shall take it at the
valuation paying the person after own mind
as one of my legatees is taken out of said valuation
to my other six children each to receive an
equally spent the of said land on said condition
I will & bequeath to have Robert and his heirs
forever

Item I will & bequeath to my beloved wife my negro
girl named Anna, during the term of her natural
life or as long as she remains my widow after
which the said wife and her interest shall be
sold and equally divided amongst my children

Item I will & bequeath all my land not above mentioned
and devised to my two sons Ebenezer Lewis &
Thomas Lewis including the slaves bequeath
to my wife and my land including said
slaves shall be equally divided between my
said two sons my wife without bordering to
have her slaves as above & as during
her natural life

Item I will & bequeath my son Robert Jonathan Lewis
and Thomas & jointly my mill tools and
crop eat so as

Item I will & bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann
one house worth fifty dollars & her saddle & bridle
and wheel & cart &c and one cow & calf &
one bed & furniture

I give I will & bequeath to my son Elisha my wife goes
that peach & provide him

I give I will & bequeath my negroes Billie Pethers day to
my seven children to be equally divided among
them either by sale and division of the price
or of valuation and those of my children that
got the said negroes to pay the other legatees who
do not get their proportion parts of the value
I give I will & bequeath to my daughter Martha McLean
two hundred dollars and to my daughter Mary
Ann Lewis two hundred dollars and to my daughter
Jane Harkrups one hundred & fifty dollars
not making her share equal to the share of
my other daughter in consequence of fifty dollars
taken of me by her husband Ely Harkrups in
sale of the land on which my son first resided
and this money to be paid to the said
Martha, Mary & Jane by my executors
out of the money on hand and sales of my
property within one year after my decease
& this is to make my daughter equal for the
lands I have given my sons

It is my will & direct that all my property
real & personal not above specified and claimed
in this my will will publicly by my executors at
at a credit of one year & that the amount
arising from such sale to gether with all money
hand on hand at my decease and all my
out standing debts (after the above spe-
cified legatees are paid as directed in this my
will) shall be so evenly divided between my wife
& seven children above named & them
& share alike

Just I constitute my sons Robert Lewis and John May Lewis and my son in law Ed. Newell to be co-executors of the my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & afft of my seal this 16th day of August 1833 done & sealed to publish by
