 proportion as follows my last will & Testament follows
 That after the payment of my just debts & funeral
 expenses I do give & be my executors having from the sale
 of my two beehives also the furniture of my house of
 every description to my Sister Jane Shelly moreover
 if there should be any monies arising from the salary
 of the congregation over which I am now Pastor
 that my Sister Jane Shelly also receive them
 And being my will to leave say other relations
 any part in my little inheritance. Further if
 friend should be willing to give Twenty dollars
 for my beehive they may take it at that price &
 the price is also to go to my Sister Jane
 I hereby certify this to be my last will & Testament
 this 29th day of September 1891.

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Penn the Recd of
 Cheshamberg County N.C. do declare being in perfect
 mind & memory (before God) I do this day the 5th of
 September in the year of our Lord 1891 do make & publish
 this my last will & Testament in manner following
 That is to say first I give & bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Sally Penn the whole benefit of my plantation
 that my Father gave me and one bee hive to Sally her self

and bedding & all Household furniture & one years pro-
visions laid off according to law by jury for to assist
her in raising the Children. This while she remains
my widow & lives on the Plantation, but if she mar-
ries or leaves the plantation, then it to be rented & go to
Schooling of the two Children Thomas Sampson Rea &
Mary Sampson Addaline Rea, and bedding & furniture to
return to Nancy Rea who give to the use of Morgan
et Rea unto them. And all household/furniture to be
sold, excepting what she brought with her & addall the
when we Married & the Cow & Calf, if it should turn out
as stated above, and divided between the two children
and all the property now on hand not mentioned to
be sold to the best advantage & pay my debts beginning
at the buying expense to do and if anything should remain
after paying all just demands to be equally divided
between my wife Sally & the Two Children Thomas
Sampson & Mary Sampson Addaline Rea, and I give &
bequeath the whole of the above Land & provision unto
my Son Thomas Rea from the date of my wife Sally's
Marriage if it should be the case or where she leaves
the plantation, & if he desires to Twenty one & has
not yet Married she is to have her living with him
while she continues so; I also hereby make & ordain James
Rea my brother & some of my brothers to be Executor of my will
In witness whereof I do set my hand & seal this day
Sept 10th 1810
