 my daughters it shall be taken & turned out of my movable
 goods to complete said sums, & the Negro & all the Re-
 mainder of my goods shall be sold at public vendue & my
 just debts & Charges shall be paid out of them & the
 remainder shall be divided amongst all my Children after
 my wife Elizabeth Sepman has drawn her third of said
 sum that is remaining of the movables, This all I do give
 & bequeath to the parties above mentioned by them freely
 to be enjoyed - Also I do hereby appoint & declare John
 Jennings & Daniel Rogers my true & lawful Executors as be-
 comes of this my last will & Testament, I do hereby dis-
 allow & revoke all other wills, Testaments former legacies
 Executors any manner before named, written & bequeathed, But
 Notwithstanding confirming this & no other to be my last will &
 Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal this 28th day of January 1783 in the 7th year of the Ame-
 rican Independence - Signed, Sealed, published pronounced
 & declared by the said Henry Sepman as his last will and
 Testament in the presence of us, who in his presence & in
 the presence of each other have subscribed our names.

& a great coat, one wearing shirt & Trowsers & one pair
of black stockings & one pair of shoes, Likewise to his
eldest son Henry five Shillings, to his second son John
one black stuff coat & green waistcoat, to his third
son Samuel my saddle, bridle & saddle bags, to his
fourth son Robert my black buckle, watch & knee
buckles & shoe buckles, to his daughter Penelope I
give & bequeath one blue rug or coverlet and my
Chest, to his daughter Margaret one bodice & petticoat
black & white - Likewise to my Cousin John Fane
I give & bequeath my bible one suit of mixed clothes, one
fine linen shirt & one pair of black stockings & one pair of
shoes, to his son John five Shillings, Likewise the
remainder of my property to be sold at public Vendue
the sum or sums from thence arising to be put to interest
& disposed of to my Sister as aforesaid - I likewise con-
stitute my Truly friend John Means the other Executor
of this my last Will & Testament, & do hereby utterly revoke
disallow & disannul all former bequests Wills & Legacies
by me heretofore in anywise left or made, Declaring this
to be my last Will & Testament, & no other to be my last Will
& Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 6th day of September in the year of our
Lord 1787. -

Tenements that lay about it & if she marries & as for my Children together she should have it for the space of fifteen years & then to fall to my four youngest sons James Robert John Samuel to be & c. & c. & c. divided among them, I likewise bequeath to my 1st. & only wife all my house hold furniture & horses, hogs & cattle sheep Hogs & farming tools, for the consideration of which I also order that she shall give each of my 4 daughters one
