Cowan Sixty Pounds Current Money of N. Carolina to be
Paid out of my Estate to her & her Heirs.

I have and bequeath to my beloved brother Joseph Cowan one
Hundred Pounds Current Money to him or to his Heirs.

I have and bequeath to my Brother John Cowan and Son John
Thirty Pounds Sterling to be Lev.^d out of my Estate or to his ^{Heirs}
And as for the true execution of this my Last will and
Testament I appoint my beloved Brother Joseph Cowan
whole and sole executor. Revoking and annulling
all wills or Testaments by me heretofore made as Contrary
thereto and none other to be my Last will & Testament in
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the
Day and Year first above written.

Whereas it appears to me that I William Cowan hath forgotten
some things things that I intended I do hereby allow this
to be a part of my will and to stand and be as if it were above
written — I have and bequeath ~~and~~ my sister

Anna & Thirty Pounds to be Paid out of my Estate to
her & her Heirs I have ^{bequeath} to my Sister Mary Thirty Pounds
to her or her Heirs.
