from & thence, which I have had at my bedchamber

3d. To Jacob Smith (son of my wife) who is now living with me  
I will & require my saddle, shot gun, shotgun & a loaded Box, & in  
the presentation thereof, those guns I desire to be sold at publick  
Sale for the most the best price, also my broad cloth & other to be  
sold in like manner.

4th. As to my last will in which it was said I published the same  
in churche less than twelve months after the payement of my  
debts out of the proceeds thereof & what ever other debts were  
produced; the remainder thereof I will & require to my  
beloved wife Betty making her day whole to her heart's content  
and in the best place & constitute & appoint my beloved wife  
Betty by name & my Uncle James Spotts by his name of this my  
last will & Testament. By these presents made, this month  
& year aforesaid all other wills & Testaments by me heretofore  
made. & declare this only to be my last will & Testament  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
signed and published & declared to be the last  
will & Testament of the said William Bennett  
by him in presence of us the subscribers  
witnesses this 2<sup>d</sup> day of August A.D. 1823.
