of Middlebury & State of New-Hampshire, being somewhat in body
but of sound mind & Memory, do make my last Will &
Testament in manner & form following Viz

First I Will & direct that after my decease my body be buried in a
decent manner, & that my funeral expenses & last debts
be paid out of my Estate -

2^d For my beloved wife Betsey I Will & bequeath all my house
& Kitchen of every description that is in or about my house
Room & Trunk, which I have adorned & furnished

3^d To Jacob Linn (son of my wife) who is now living with me
I Will & bequeath my saddle, shot gun, & shot bag & a silver box for him

4th My plantation tools, & horse gear I direct to be sold at publick
sale for the most the will bring, also my book rack & other to be
sold in like manner -

5th As to my land my Will is that it be sold at publick sale or as
I shall not live than Twelve months after the payment of my
debts out of the proceeds thereof & what ever other sales have
been made; The remainder thereof I Will & bequeath to my
beloved wife Betsey making her my whole sole Heir & Legatee
And in the last place I constitute & appoint my beloved wife
Betsey executrix & my Uncle James Spratt Esq. Receiver of this my
last Will & Testament; & by these presents revoke, disannul
& make void all other Wills & Testaments by me heretofore
made, & declare this only to be my last Will & Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
Signed sealed published & declared to be the last
Will & Testament of the said William Barnard
by him in presence of us the subscribing
witnesses this 2^d day of August 1823 -
