sound mind & memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body & that
it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make this my last will
& Testament in the manner & form as follows Viz
I give & devise & bequeath my land to my three sons Jose Corum
James Corum & Robert Corum Equally to be divided between the
three as they can agree allowing my father & mother where they live
during their natural lives all the land that is now cleared or
they may want to clear for their support joining them as
stations not wasting the timber, also I give & bequeath to my
well beloved wife Abigail Corum all the clear land now &
my possessions or she may want to clear for the support of the
family to continue during her widowhood, And I give & bequeath
to my loving daughter Elizabeth Corum three pounds ten shillings
in two years after my decease, also one box something from the
hearth cloth I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Corum
Mary Corum each of them one good bed & bed clothes & that I order
that all my lawful debts be paid and all the rest of my down
Horse, Hogs & Stock with all my farming utensils with all
household furniture also all the grain I give & bequeath to my
loving wife Abigail Corum — I order & appoint Alexander

Porter and my wife Abigail Corum whole & sole Executors of the my last Will & Testament. Revoking & disannulling all former wills by me made & acknowledging this to be my last will & Testament in the presence of - this 14th day of September 1794 -

I, Alexander Craighead of New Kent County in N^c Carolina Minister of the Gospel being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be God for this same calling to mind the uncertainty of my time in this transitory world & that it is appointed for all men once to die; Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say I recommend my Soul & Body to God that gave it - As to what worldly goods that God bestowed upon me I dispose of as follows -

Item, I order that my last debts & funeral expenses be paid & discharged by my Executors hereafter named

Item, I order that it is my will that my well beloved wife Jane Craighead shall enjoy & possess the benefit of my plantation where I now live and my plantation upon Longcreek & the whole of it thereof and likewise the use & benefit of all the negroes I now possess for the support of my family during the time she bears my name -

Item, I give & bequeath unto my Eldest daughter Margaret five hundred current money to be delivered five years after my decease -

Item, I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary five hundred current money to be delivered five years after my decease -

Item, I give & bequeath unto my daughter Jane sixty pounds here money or one Negro which my Executors shall see fit in most convenient to give, besides Horse Saddle & Bridle, bed &c. furniture which is to be delivered as soon as convenient after her marriage -

Item, I give & bequeath the same to each of my other daughters Rachel, Mary & Elizabeth to be delivered agreeable to the same manner as above to my daughter Jane -

Item, I give & bequeath to my sons Robert & Thomas & George the my be
