In the name of God Amen. The 15<sup>th</sup> day of October on the year of  
our Lord 1780 I William Davidson of Braxton County in the Province  
of S. Carolina subscriber Being very sick in body but of perfect  
mind & memory Thanks be to God therefore calling unto mind  
the mortality of mankind & knowing that it is appointed for all  
men once to die, I now make & declare this my last will & testament  
that is to say principally & first of all I give & command my soul  
to God that gave it & for my body I command to the Earth to be  
buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion  
of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection  
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God -  
And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God  
to bless me in this life, I give & bequeath & dispose of the same in the  
following manner and form -

I will require & declare that sale be made of my land etc  
that the price of the same be converted to the use of my son Isaac to the  
best advantage -

I give & bequeath to Mary my Dearey & well beloved wife my  
black mare with a saddle & bridle, together with a fashion b  
furniture by her freely to be passed & enjoyed, and also the use &  
benefit of my bay horse & his head of herbs & all the bowkinds together  
with all my moveable or personal estate whatsoever by her freely  
to be passed & enjoyed during her widowhood, & after her marriage  
all & every of the same Execution of the Black mare shall be  
bridled together with the bay & furnished to be sold & equally di-  
vided with her & my children -

I likewise will require & declare that sale be made of my Dearey  
mare & two young colts & the price equally divided in the same  
manner

I likewise require & ordain that my beloved brother George Davidson return together with my well beloved wife Mary Davidson & my beloved brother-in-law John Mc'Callum be my only & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament, & I do hereby utterly disallow & revoke & disannul all & every other former Will, Testaments & Legacies Bequests & Counterbequests by me in any wise before this time made & Begun at this Date signing & confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year first above written

And as to my worldly Estate I will & command that first of all my lawful debts & funeral charges be paid out of my Estate which I will & bequeath unto my loving wife Hannah Dwyer all the remainder of my Estate whether real or personal same to be remained her own & at all times to be at her disposal & to her own use & benefit - Having revoked & making void all other bequests & legacies Davidson inheritance by me made & done in any way or manner what so ever - And lastly I will constitute & appoint my loving wife Hannah Dwyer Executor of this my last Will & Testament -
