God to bless me with, I will & desire that my just debts & funeral expenses
be first paid & the remainder to be distributed as follows. Item
Item. I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hugins one hundred

leaving her undivided half her marriage or widow to be the pro-
perty of my beloved son John Hugins which negro I leave to support
my family while they live together to support & make gain for them
otherwise one bed & furniture to her my said wife & one Negro Girl
named Juliet while she my said wife lives single & then either her

so many leavers from such sale to be equally divided among
my three sons Joseph Hugins, William Hugins & John Hugins & the

Item. I give & bequeath to my beloved son Joseph Hugins one Negro fellow
named Africa, I give & bequeath to my beloved son William Hugins
one Negro girl named Anna & in it consists all that I deserve may

be given at a year & to my beloved daughter Sarah Gray &
Bequeath to my beloved sons Joseph Haines, William Haines
John Haines the land between I have & the Land I possess in
Indian bound to be Equally divided among them at the de-
sire of my Executors & I desire that all the remainder of
Land be sold to pay my debts if required & if not to be equal-
ly divided among my sons, the remainder of my estate I desire it
Equally divided or sold at publick Vandel as my Executors
think most suitable to the advantage of the Legatees. Now I
to my beloved daughter Mary Haines our Negro Girl named Lu-
which she has now in possess. in land I do hereby consti-
& appoint as my Executors my beloved wife Mary Haines & my
beloved son Joseph Haines & my friend William Potts, I do her-
