Sampson & Mr Charles House executors of this my last will &
& testament and I do hereby utterly disallow & make
disannul ~~all~~ & every other former testament, will, legacies
bequests & executors by me in any wise before named, settled,
& begun, ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my
last will & testament the witness whereof have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 25th day of July in the year of our Lord
1781 - Signed, sealed, published, pronounced & declared
by the said Charles Frederick as his last will &
testament in the presence of us, who in his presence &

our names



our Lord 1791 I John Sampson being nearly 81st of my
age, being in a distressing weak state of body, but of perfect
mind & memory, thanks be to God for his mercies & calling to mind
the mortality of my body, & that it is appointed unto all men
once to die, Do make & ordain this my last will & testament
that is to say principally & first of all I recommend my soul

To & Almighty God who gave it to me, I ord, to the rest to be
 buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of
 my Friends nothing doubting but at the general
 Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
 power of God, & leaving my worldly Estate where
 with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life & in dominion
 I dispose of in the following manner & form. I give &
 I give & bequeath unto Sarah my wife beloved wife all my ac-
 tual & personal having heretofore had; I do give and
 bequeath at the death of my wife all my personal Estate
 Cows, Horses, Sheep & Hogs I household goods to be divided & que-
 d among my children fine Beamy, William son & John son
 Mary Adamson & Thomas son & Samuel son & Joseph son
 & Christopher son & Sarah son, and I do give & bequeath to
 my sweet daughter Elizabeth daughter Stewart Banks eight
 Shillings; & thicke I do give & bequeath to my well beloved son
 David & Christopher son the plantation wherein I now live
 to be enjoyed by them in full possession at the death of my
 wife; Joseph Tuck & James Neel, I constitute & appoint
 Executrix of this my last will & Testament, and I do hereby
 dislodge & Revoke & disannul all former other former
 Wills, Testaments, Legacies & grants bequests by me in any way
 before named, made & the method, ratifying & confirming
 this & no other to be my last will & Testament. In witness
 whereof I have caused to set my hand & seal the day & year first
 written. Signed sealed, published, pronounced &
 declared by the John Low as his last will & test-
