Testum to Yr Hon^{rs} Dec 1832

In the name of God Amen.

I William Campbell of the State of N Carolina Mecklenburg
County on the 14th of September in the year of our Lord 1832
being in perfect memory. Doth will & dispose of
my property in the following manner - 1st I bequeath to
my son William McGill & his wife Betty the plantation
where the same have been their natural lifetime &
then to go to their heirs with all the other property that
I gave him 2nd I bequeath to my son chosen the price
of the plantation which he has already received also a
negro boy named Dick 3rd I will & bequeath to my daughter
Sally Hove a negro Girl named Nancy also the Five
hundred dollars which she received from me and all
the other property which she got. 4th I will & bequeath
to the heirs of my son Hugh Ten dollars to be equally
divided amongst them also the plantation Deeded
to my son Hugh which I intended as his part of my estate
5th I will & bequeath to my son John part of the plantation
whereon I was here beginning on my own & Morrisons
line at mouth of Morrisons old Land Running a straight
line to the mouth of my Spring branch & up the Spring
branch its veins corners till it strikes this line all
the Land West of this named dividing line, I also give
to my son John my negro boy named John -
6th I will & bequeath to my daughter Peggy Allen
my Negro Girl named Penny with all her share in

1st I will & bequeath to my Daughter Griszelle
 forever my negro girl named Cynthia with all the
 other property I have given her & I will & bequeath
 to my Daughter Sarah my negro boy named Sam with
 all the other property I have given him & I will & bequeath
 to my Daughter Polly my negro boy named Bob with
 all the other property that I have given him

2nd I will & bequeath to my daughter Anny Morris
 a negro child named Harvey & a negro boy named
Sam with all the other things I have given her —

3rd I will & bequeath to Samuel & James the balance of
 my plantation on which I now live & my negro man
George & my negro woman Mary by their paying to the
 State Tax assessed £10 & when he is at
 the age of twenty £10 & when a boy more & let his
 choice of work & beating; I will that my books be
 divided between my two sons John and James
 I will & bequeath to Samuel & also to James
£100 one hundred acres of land to each, of my new
 survey already layed off to them. I wish also to be
 laid with my present crop & £100 of my new
 crop & every other article necessary when all my just
 debts & several expenses are paid; the remainder to be
 equally divided amongst my four daughters, Polly
Griszelle, Polly & Harvey I appoint my
 son John & Robert my Executors to this my last
 will & testament, in witness whereof I William Matthews
 have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above
 written.
