In the name of God Amen The 26th day of November in the year of
our Lords 1780. William M'Donnell of Northampton County and
province of Ulster of &c. actions being in proper mind & memory, thanks
be to God. Therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body & know-
ing that it is appointed for all men once to die; Do make & declare this
my last Will & Testament that is to say Principally & first of all I give
& recommend my soul unto the hands of God Almighty who gave it and
my body to the earth to be buried in a decent & Christian like manner at
the discretion of my Executors herein after named nothing doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God. And astonishing such worldly like apprehensions it
has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise & dispose of in the
following manner & form. — My first I give & bequeath to my dearly
beloved wife Hester M'Donnell the privilege of having her maintenance
or living off my plantation whereon I now live during her life to wit with
all my household furniture with her horse saddle & bridle bed & furniture
& two cows & calves which is wholly to be at her own disposal Each one of
her things as she sees direct. Nevertheless it is my will & desire & I do
hereby give & bequeath the the said plantation wholly & solely to my
dearly beloved daughter Dorothy M'Donnell to have is to be what
her own property at the age of eighteen years (except her mother Hester
M'Donnell's maintenance as aforesaid) which she is to have as aforesaid
but in case the said Dorothy M'Donnell dies before she comes of that
age that then at the decease of my beloved wife Hester M'Donnell the
said plantation is to be sold & the price thereof to be equally divided
amongst my Daughters then surviving but on the contrary that
to enjoy the said in her own right & to be kept as before excepted

Also I give & bequeath unto my Eldest Daughter, Margaret M'Donnell the sum of £100 by pounds, in Gold or Silver at former rates viz. 20s per Pound at Twenty Shillings & eleven & eight Shillings & nine pence or in any Equivalent or at the same rate as if paid or whatever that sum will be or is worth in the circulating paper currency now or at this present time passing for Money with a Bank & Bankers.

Also I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Heron the sum of ten pounds Currency to be paid out of my Estate.

Also I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Hillis the sum of ten pounds Currency to be paid out of my Estate.

Also I give & bequeath unto my Son in Law Robert Hillis husband of my Daughter Sarah Hillis my last coat of wearing Apparel.

Also I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Hester M'Donnell a Horse saddle & bridle & also a bed & furniture & also clothing at the discretion of my Executors to be equal with the other Siblings as my Executors shall Judge or if such cannot be procured the value thereof in money as they shall Judge sufficient.

Also at the end of my Estate not herein mentioned to be as Equitably amongst my four daughters viz. Margaret, Jane, Sarah & Hester as shall be found Equitable by my Executors herein after named after paying all my last debts & general Expenses.

And Lastly, I do hereby constitute make Ordain & appoint my beloved wife Hester M'Donnell Executrix & my truly friend John M'Dale (formerly brother in law to the late David M'Dale Esq. Executor of this my last will & Testament, and I do hereby disavow all other & former wills & Bequests to whatever, hereby Notifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament.

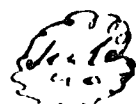
