I Andrew B Wilson of the County of Charlotte being & State of N.C. a citizen of sound and perfect mind & memory (blessed be God) Do this 20th day of September in the year of our Lord 1832 make & publish this my last will & testament in the manner following That is to say First I will & bequeath to my Mother all this land & property by her to be fully possessed & enjoyed I also will & bequeath to my Mother all the notes and money that I have, and for her to dispose of all this property as she sees proper This my last will and Testament, for witness whereof I the said Andrew B. Wilson have to this my last will & Testament set my hand the day of year above written

In the name of God lesson. I William B. King being in an infirm state of Health but of sound disposing mind and remembering the certainty of life & death conscious that I must ere long leave this stage of existence have made and constituted this my last will & testament hereby reciting all others by me made

First I give my soul up into the hands of God who giveth in full belief of this resurrection of my body and final acceptance in the Kingdom of Judgment thereby the atoning merits of the Lord Jesus Christ I will allow my Body to be decently buried in ordinary plain form at the discretion of my friends.

With respect to that portion of property which God in his goodness has committed to my care after paying my just debts & funeral expenses I bequeath as follows viz -

Item 1 I bequeath unto my grandson William son of John B. King

- One negro boy named Dick -
- Item 2^d I bequeath unto my granddaughter Nancy, daughter of John McRae one Bed & furniture with second bottom
- Item 3^d I bequeath unto my granddaughter Margaret McRae one negro Girl named Fanny, conditioned that she will Marry either shall pay, and half of the Value of said Girl Fanny to his Sister Susan and when she said Margaret C. McRae dies at the age of Twenty one years, it is my will that Susanna McRae mother of said Margaret & Susan and shall have the use & benefit of said Fanny until said Margaret dies to the age of Twenty one years & P. Fairway not to be freed out.
- Item 4^d I bequeath unto my Granddaughter Margaret daughter of James McRae one negro Girl named Esther, said negro girl is to be to the use & benefit of the parents of the Margaret until said Margaret dies to the age of Twenty one year I also bequeath to Margaret one of my large looking glasses
- Item 5^d I bequeath unto my grandson William son of James McRae that tract of Land containing one hundred & forty four acres inclosing the plantation on which Eliza McRae now lives said land lying from the way you cast as appears by a place laid down by John Black -
- Item 6^d I bequeath unto my granddaughter Margaret daughter of Morrison McRae One hundred dollars to be paid to her by my executors at the end of one year after my death
- Item 7^d I bequeath unto my grandson William son of Morrison McRae the residue of the plantation on which I now live with all the apparatus except help the Interest in the Cotton gin Screen & Thresher & the House & running works attached to them for use which help Interest I bequeath unto Passey McRae & her family who the other half Interest to said William his Master Eliza McRae & her family the same machinery & house to be held jointly where they have had. I also bequeath unto said

William a negro boy named Harry and my negro woman named
Hannah together with her child named Jessie, condition that
he said William shall pay to my Executrix two hundred
and fifty dollars in twelve months after my decease, and
also said William shall pay to each of his three Sisters
Ruthie Polly & Charlotte one hundred dollars each when they
respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years, and pay
to said Negro women ~~one~~ ten dollars yearly for five
years from my decease, this my will that said William
shall take the choice of my two old negro women Frances
and Rose & either have them to live on the plantation with
him & occupy their own house which they now live in
and that said种植者 do to provide for their comfort
and sustenance while they live.

Item 8th I bequeath unto my grandson Elias son of Morrison sixteen two
hundred & twenty six acres of land overlooking his mother's
grave at her death lying west of the dragon road on
which his mother resided, on condition that said Elias
pay to each of his sisters my Ruthie, Polly & Charlotte Twenty
five dollars as the respectively arrives to the age of twenty
one years, also I bequeath unto Elias my negro boy Sampson

Item 9th I bequeath unto my granddaughter Martha daughter of Morrison.

With my negro girl Hester together with one bush of windmill grass

Item 10th I bequeath unto my granddaughter Elizabeth daughter of John

McKee my Chest of Drawers.

Item 11th It is my will that my negro men Sam & Prince be permitted
to choose their masters to buy them provided such masters
shall pay to my Executrix two hundred dollars in twelve
months after my decease for Sam and pay to said Negro Sam
fifty dollars yearly for two years in recompence

William & my boy named Harry and my negro woman named
Hannah together with her child named Lydia, condition that
he said William shall pay to my Executrix two hundred
and fifty dollars in twelve months after my decease, and
also said William shall pay to each of his three Sisters
Rebecca Polly & Amelia one hundred dollars cash when they
respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years, and pay
to said Negro woman Hannah ten dollars yearly for five
years from my death. This my will that said William
shall take the choice of my two old negro women Frances
and Rose & let her there to live on the plantation with
him & occupy their own house which they now live in
and that said location doth provide for their comfort
and sustenance while they live.

Item 8th. I bequeath unto my grandson Elias son of Morrison & his two
hundred & twenty six acres of Land bordering his Mother's
down at her death lying west of the wagon road on
which his Mother travelled. On condition that said Elias
pay to each of his sisters viz. Rebecca, Polly & Amelia Twenty
five dollars as the respectively arrive to the age of twenty
one years. Also I bequeath unto R. Elias my negro boy Sampson

Item 9th I bequeath unto my granddaughter Annie daughter of Morrison
my negro girl Hannah together with one book & penitence
Item 10th I bequeath unto my granddaughter Polly daughter of Morrison & her
my negro girl Mary together with one of my large looking
slippers and one ~~handkerchief~~.

Item 11th I bequeath unto my granddaughter Elizabeth daughter of John
Miles my Chest of Diamonds.

Item 12th It is my will that my negro man Sam & Prince be permitted
to choose their masters to buy them provided such masters
shall pay to my Executrix two hundred dollars in twelve
months after my decease for Sam and pay to said Negro Prince
fifteen dollars yearly for ten years in succession.

But the brother of River Steele paid me £2000 in January for
Dredging before 3 months after my decease & payed to said River
for his share, reasonably for five years in prospecting.

Item 13rd. It is my will that the plantation on which Charles & I resided

now lies be exposed to publick sale by my Executor & credit of
one, two, three, four, five equal payments to be made by the
purchase. I hereby qualify Executors to convey the same
land to the benevolent and worthy constituents my Executor
may appoint to receive and the money arising from the sale of
said land to my executors in equal parts to the four parent
Institutions viz. Missions, Bible, West End Day School
Societies of the Methodist Episcopalian Church in the United
States of America & by said Executors to be appropriated
as their wisdom & Piety may concur to be most to the
Glory of God & the good of souls of the human family.

Item 14th. I bequeath unto my dear Daughter in law Eliza & Prentiss
whom each one hundred bushels -

Item 15th. I bequeath unto my nephew Richard Brown one negro boy
named Billy, & a bay moccasin blind & one high post to
stand back of furniture black curtains, and all the chair
were his Aunt brought with her to my house, and all
his fathers & aunts books & such other books as I may
writ or order his executors to be wrote in and back of
the last shall be all known to be called his in this town.

Item 16th. It is my will that the residue of my books not mentioned
in this my will be divided into three equal lots
& distributed as follows to John Mc Kee family one lot
to James Mc Kee one lot & to Morrison Mc Kee family
one lot -

Item 17th. It is my will that all my plowing tools viz ploughs Har-
rows, hoes, Mattocks, hoes etc be divided into four lots
& be distributed to my four grandsons William Mc Kee
& his Brother Henry each a lot, and to William

McKee & his brother Elias each a Lot
Item 18th I bequeath unto my friends William Herod & John Saenger
one Cow & Calf & two Volumes of Clark's commentary on the new
Testament.

I astly nominate and appoint James McKee Dost David R
Dunkley & James Hickman my executors to execute this my
last will & testament. In witness whereof I the said William

McKee have to this my last will & testament set my hand

I William McKee do hereby will & bequeath in addition
to my foregoing will the following making this addition equally
valid with the foregoing will follows -

I will & bequeath unto my daughters Hannah Rose and
Henrich the flock of goats on my plantation as I had formerly
given those to said daughters also I bequeath to them all the
goats they have on hand till the last work now on
hand be a certain goat which I had formerly given to
Henrich & Rose together two Calves

If any will that the rest of my family remain on my
plantation until my death shall be gathered and if
Richard Brown remains with my hand setting and
managing the harvest crop until it is gathered & have
during the ~~next~~ last crop of small grain for next
season said Richard Brown shall have the half of
the present crop with the fourth part of the next profit
of the small crop. Moreover said Richard Brown

shall be kept up together with my present family out
of my estate until said crop be gathered, also it is my
will that Elizewell Lee & Edmund Lee shall not pay
any thing for their something with me this year.

Doth make this my last will & testament.

I will that my just debts be paid.

I. I will bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret
McKnight a sufficient support of my plantation during
her widowhood with the use of my dwelling house
& out Buildings, also the use of all of my household
& kitchen furniture for herself & my family while
they remain in a family capacity.

2d. I Will & bequeath to my beloved son viz. James
McKnight, Robert & John & McKnight all my
plantation whereon lies, also my Meadow lands
and also my interest in the Bellance of my fathers old
plantation & all to be equally divided among them
according to the value thereof with exception of
respect unto my wife & my daughters while they
remain single and my two sisters (viz. Jane and
Susannah McKnight to be in the house they now
occupy & to have a reasonable proportion of the farm as
long as they live and proper to occupy it and to be
supported as my father used to do.

3d. I Will that my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Sheep also my
farming Utencils together with my part or interest in the
leagoo to remain owing promises to the use of my family
while they remain in a family capacity.
