I desire it may be received by all as such; first I most Humbly
 beseeche my Son to God my Master & Saviour his most gracious
compliment of thank the all sufficient merit & mediation of Jesus
Christ, in so far as he doth attain to all that come unto
God by him; I give my body to the Earth from whence it was taken
in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day
as for my burial I desire it may be decent & the direction
of my dear wife to be hereafter observed, as to my child &
postle I do especially wish that all my just debts be paid
First I give & bequeath to my dear & loving wife that part of
my plantation which I now live & wherein of the part that
I said to my brother Robert to have & to hold the same as her own
property & to dispose of as she may see fit & together with the whole
of the household furniture that I am possessed of likewise one
horse or mare & two cows, following her choice of all my Stock, also
farming utensils such as may be needed for the use of the plan-
tation & likewise one half of my Stock of sheep & hogs, as to the part
of my plantation that I have sold to my son the same & if he keep the
land agreeable to me or, in other words like myself, to my
beloved wife fifty pounds of the price of said land, and that my Execut-
tive to him & paid for said land, & that if he does not keep the land
the same way I expect you to let me know, & take the care
of its improvement & as it is now in said land, I likewise
give & bequeath to my brother Robert the whole of my weaning
apparel, I likewise give & bequeath to my brother John the money
in full that in regard me in consequence of his & his wife's
by me, the remaining part of my estate I order as soon as may be
convenient after my decease to be sold at public sale & after all
my debts are paid whatever may remain to be equally divided betw
my wife & two & three children Alexander & John & William

Sarah Melia that is now living with us. And also constituted Abraham Alexander & Robert March Executors of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this third day of September in the year of our Lord 1800.

In the name of God our Saviour. I William Merchant, being weak in body but of perfect sound mind & judgment, but calling to mind the mortality of my body & that it is appointed for all men once to die, have made & appointed this my last will & testament, hereby revoking & making null & void all other wills by me made or done to all intents & purposes as if they had never been made or done; and first I recommend myself to God that gave & is keeping for mercy thro' the merits & righteousness of our Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ. And I command my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors in a Christian & decent manner in hopes of a glorious resurrection at the day of general Judgment. And I will that all my lawful debts be paid & And next I will I bequeath to my loving wife Jane Merchant her sume & allane of this land on which I now live & after my wifes death I will & appoint that my son William Smith Merchant shall have the whole of the Land & also immediately after my wifes death of land is laid off as said, that said William Smith Merchant when of full age shall have the full use & Benefit of the remainder & further that said William Merchant shall have twenty five acres that Thomas Kirkpatrick has promised to make one a deed for out of the fifty acres said Thomas entered for himself & me if said Thomas Kirkpatrick obtains a patent for the same, & I will & appoint that the said Thomas Kirkpatrick make a deed to said William Smith Merchant in said Merchants own name, but if said land is lost by any means so that said William Smith Merchant can not obtain a deed for the same I will & appoint that I & my son William Smith Merchant shall not lay any claim to the remainder of my estate either real or personal but shall loss the Land & its value, and next I will unto my son John Merchant her land
