In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, William Remy of the County of  
New York, State of New York, do hereby certify that in body but  
in no manner of admittance, God having the care of my soul  
and of my affairs, to regard the mortality of man; Do  
make, declare in & constitute this my last will & Testament  
writing & disposing of all that I have in the world, my only  
purpose, I leave to my beloved wife Betty Remy during her  
natural life in widowhood the plantation whereon I now  
live with my beloved son Robert Remy, come to law-  
ful age, then for her my beloved wife to have the use of  
the one third part (her share) of the plantation during  
her widowhood also two choice horses, one cow & all  
the household, furniture, but should she marry again after  
my decease give up all the same with the property to  
my children except such as is in the household, furniture

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Robert Remy the  
plantation before mentioned at the choice or further  
marriage of my wife except the child she is now pregnant  
with be a boy then if he arrives at lawful age he shall  
by my choice have the use of the said plantation -

Item It is my will that all the rest of the property I have be on  
the good pleasure of God to bestow as he shall see fit at the  
direction of my Executors & the money therein arising be  
put out on interest & about the beginning of the year 1796  
the same of the interest & principal then be equally divided all my  
several debts paid. Lastly I do hereby appoint & ordain  
my friends John Kelly & James Lee others Executors  
of this my last will & Testament, in witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal this 21<sup>st</sup> day of June AD 1796
