 revoke disannul all & every other former wills be-
 -gasse, bequeaths & bequests by me in any wise before
 named, written & executed, Ratifying & confirming this &

& not before. Then I give & bequeath to my well beloved
son Joseph Sample the sum of Seventy five pounds -
Then I give & bequeath to my well beloved son William
Sample the sum of Fifty pounds Then I give & bequeath
to my well beloved daughter Mary Hannah the sum
of Ten pounds. Then I give & bequeath to my well beloved
daughter Esther Sample the sum of One hundred pounds
to be kept by my Executors & laid out for her use at their
discretion & in case of her death before the arrival to
Thirty two years of age the remainder of her Legacy
to be equally divided among my other children
It is further my will & pleasure that these Legacies be paid in
proportion to each Legatee as the money comes to hand, It is
further my will & pleasure that after my just debts & the
Legacies are paid, an equal division of the remainder of
my estate be made among all my children Except John
I do likewise appoint & constitute Esther my wife and
Mary Hannah my daughter to be my sole Executors
of this my last will & testament And I do hereby collect
disallow & disannul & make other be.

in the province of New Carolina, being in a weak & low condition
of body but of a sound mind & in perfect memory thanks be
to God for all his mercies, taking into consideration the
mortality of my nature, do judge it expedient to constitute
& make this as my last Will & Testament, First, I do give &
bequeath my soul to Almighty God from whom I received it
& my body to be decently interred at the discretion of my
friends being certain that it shall be raised at the last day
Secondly of my whole worldly Estate which divine provi-
dence has been pleased to grant me I do hereby appoint
& constitute my brother William Scott my sole executor
empowering him to pay my lawfull debts & settle my affairs
which worldly Estate I dispose of in the following manner viz
I do give & bequeath unto James Scott son of my brother
