 should be empowered to divide the above mentioned property  
 equally amongst the children, with such to be added as  
 may be & divide the proceeds thereof which may they may think  
 fit.



I also will that if my family do fail to pay my Debts that  
 there be a sufficiency of my Stocks sold to ensure that purpose  
 I also will that my negro boy Edmund be exposed to public sale &  
 the money arising from said sale to be put to interest untill  
 the Children become of legal age each of them become of age  
 they are then to draw their equal proportion of said money  
 arising from said sale ~~but~~ that if my wife & family should  
 wish to remove to the West that my executor or the sale of  
 my land to the best advantage & place the money arising  
 from said sale in the hands of any two or three reasonable  
 persons who may give bond with sufficient sure-  
 -rily to the County Court of our said County that the  
 said money shall be applied to the use of purchasing land  
 in the Western Country for the benefit of my Children  
 I also will that none of the before mentioned property be  
 subject to any debts that the family may contract  
 I also constitute Samuel Berry hitherto my executor in this  
 my last will & testament, in witness whereof I have here-
