Anne Sloan my bonnet 4 one pair of linnen gloves - &  
Anne Sloan my bread server & all the rest of my property  
be sold on a credit of twelve months & equally divided  
between William Bigham of Lincoln County & William  
Graham that lives with me, Phebe Whiteside, Jane  
Nelson, Margaret Patterson & Robert Sloan with four  
daughters out of the same to Margaret Mc Kee -  
and lastly I instruct & ordain & appoint William  
Bigham of Lincoln County & Robert Sloan Executors  
of this my last Will & Testament - signed Sealed

I do this the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord 1814  
Do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in  
the manner following that is to say first I give & bequeath  
unto my beloved wife Cherry the whole benefit of my  
plantation I live on to raise the children during her  
widowhood, if marrying then what the time comes to her  
gray mare & black colt 4 m. low & hard with

fixing thereto. Some pair of Geers, two axes one Mattock & three Hoes, one Spade & all the Bedding & Chapman furniture, choice of the Tables, one Trunk & Chairs, wheels & Cards, Loom & Treadles two pots & two bowls two smaller pots & two spoons, two looms & Calves. One to Barbery my daughter besides one small two year old Heifer, one Sow & four Pigs, one large Boar one other sow & sixe Hounds. Your Young Son to my Daughter Barber, two Ewes & Lambs choice, The plantation I bought of Blackburn to be rented & there will be choice. And I hereby make & ordain my worthy friend John Read Executor of this my last Will & Testament, in Waburn where I set my hand & seal the date above.

N.B. My son Jackson to be left him of my plantation I leave one. Likewise my Mother to have the plantation she now lives on to be her own property forever -

December the 23<sup>d</sup> 1816 Being in sound mind & memory I do make this alteration in my last Will & Testament, my beloved wife Mary if she marries she holds the Gray Mare & saddle one cow & calf. One bed & furniture & all the remainder to be sold & equally divided between her & my children, where unto I set my hand & seal date above.
