And lastly I institute & appoint William
Bigham of Lincoln County & Robert Sloan Executors
of this my last will & Testament - Signed Sealed in
the presence of us this 9th day of May 1814 -

I William Secret of North Carolina County & of the law
being of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed in God
I do this the 6th day of May in the year of our Lord 1814
Do make & publish this my last will & Testament in
maner following that is to say first I give & bequeath
unto my beloved wife Mary the whole benefit of my
plantation I live on to raise the children during her
widowhood, if married then what she shall desire to be
gray mare & black colt & one low & black with

fixing thereto, some pair of Geese, two cows one Mottled & three
Hoes, one Spade & all the bedding & draper furniture, chains of
the Table, one Trunk & Chairs, beds & Cords, Loom & Fishings
two pots & two barrels two smaller pots & two pails, two cows
& Calves, & one to Barbery my daughter besides one small
two year old Heifer, one sow & four Shoats, one large Hound
one other sow & four Shoats & one young sow to my daughter
Barbery, two Ewes & Lambs choice, the plantation bought
of Blackburn to be rented & three bells choice, and I
hereby make & declare my worthy friend John Peas
Executor of this my last will & Testament, In Witness whereof
I set my hand & seal the date above.

December the 29th 1816 Being in sound mind & memory I do

one cow & calf, one bed & furniture & all the remainder to be
sold & equally divided between her & my children, where-
unto I set my hand & seal the date above.
