On the 20th of March in the year of our Lord 1812 Harry Emerson  
son of Charlotte Moultrie County of Carolina Being in a  
very low weak state of body but of sound mind & memory, sent  
for & called Doctor Thomas Henderson, William Carson, William  
Allison Barto, and William Allison said who being all present  
did them & those in the presence & hearing of us the above named  
doctors & say that his object in calling us was that he the said  
Harry Emerson just had made no' t ill, that he gave the  
whole of his property to his wife except two negro boys which  
he gave to his brother Billy Emerson being asked by Dr. D.  
Thomas Henderson the names of the two negro boys, he said he  
left his two negro boys one named Harry & the other named  
Ben to his brother Billy Emerson, and all his other property  
to his wife & not a shilling to any other person, which he  
directed us or some of us to commit to writing within the  
time specified by law.

In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 26<sup>th</sup>  
of March 1812.

In the name of God the Father & Son I William Abbott Emerson of Wm. Abbot  
being County & State of N.C. Carolina Being of perfect mind and  
Memory & reflecting on the uncertainty of this mortal life, do  
make & execute this my last will & Testament in manner  
& form following to wit I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah  
Emerson one Negro woman named Millie & her three children  
Henry, William & Eliza also and Negro woman named Betty & her two

15 Charlotte, our negro boy called Ben, together with all my Negros of house  
Cows & Hogs the tract of land whereon I now live with all my household  
& kitchen furniture farming utensils &c leaving my said heir to  
all intents & purposes. I do hereby nominate & appoint her as  
my Executrix to this my last will & Testament, disannulling and  
retracting every former will by me made, and confirming this  
& none other to be my last will & Testament, in witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of January  
1814 In presence of

20 In the name of God amen. This 6<sup>th</sup> day of July 1816  
I Anna Emerson of the County of Rockbridge in the State of Virginia  
being old & weak in years & calling to mind my mortality  
& that it is appointed for all men to die. Do make this my last will  
and Testament. First I recommend my soul to God who gave it  
my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner. And as  
touching my worldly estate It is my will & order that my funeral  
expenses be paid & satisfied—2d I give & bequeath to my loving  
daughter Sally Ross for the love good will & affection I have  
to her this plantation whereon I now live containing one  
hundred & Twenty acres more or less. And for the kindness  
that my Grand daughter has paid to me. That is to say Nancy  
Green I do give & bequeath to her one hundred & five dollars  
hereby revoking & disannulling all other wills & bequests  
by me hitherto. Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be  
my last will & Testament. Signed sealed pronounced &  
delivered by the said Anna Emerson of her last will and
