39 In the name of God Amen. I William Wallace of the County of
Hertfordshire State of Carolina, being weak in body but of
sound mind & memory, but calling to mind that it is appointed
for all men once to die, Do make & Ordain this my last will and
Testament. I recommend my Soul to Almighty God who gave it
and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God in this life to bestow, I do will & bequeath in the following
manner & form viz. Item, I will & bequeath to my beloved wife
Hannah during her natural life or widowhood the one half of all the
land I possess including the House & improvement, where I now live
the land to be divided by two or three neighbours chosen by my Exrs
and also after sufficient property is sold to pay all my just debts
I leave to my said wife all the farming tools, household & Kitchen
furniture, all the Negroes & Stock of every kind, not hereafter
specially willed, until my youngest child comes of age to be
with her to help to raise & school the Children during her widowhood
I do further will to my said wife her choice of any Negroes & hogs
on the plantation to be forever at her own disposal —
Item, I will & bequeath to my Daughter Peggy Lucinda a good horse
saddle & bridle, two good Cows & Calves, a Bureau & such other
Household furniture as my Executors may think right likewise
a Negro Girl named Lucy. — Item, I will & bequeath to my daughter
Susan Frewin a good horse saddle & bridle two good Cows & Calves
a Bureau & such other Household furniture as my Executors may
think right & likewise a Negro Girl named Maria. I provided
any of the aforesaid Negroes, Lucy or Maria should ever prove to

my said Daughter going to a Home of their own to live or arriving at the age of Twenty, in years, in that case they are to receive out of the Estate another negro of equal value or the worth thereof in Cash. I will & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth when she comes of age a good horse saddle & bridle, two good linen & calico dresses & other household furniture equal to her sisters, likewise a negro as high the value of them as possible or the value thereof in Cash. I will & bequeath to my Daughter Martha Deane when she comes of age a good horse saddle & bridle, two good linen & calico dresses & other household furniture equal to her other sisters, also a negro as high the value of the others as possible, or the value thereof in Cash. I will & bequeath to my son Ezekiel Columbus the one half of all my lands including the house & improvement where I formerly lived to be divided & laid off as before stated, but provided a crop should be on the aforesaid land at my decease said crop is to go to the use of the family equally--

I will & bequeath to my son & Marguerite Lafayette the plantation whereon I now live & the other lands before stated which is to be annexed thereto, subject however to the aforesaid incumbrance of my said wife's life or widowhood and lastly on my wife's intestacy or when my youngest child comes of age, all property not bequeathed is to be sold by my Executors & the proceeds thereof to be equally divided among my wife & surviving children each drawing an equal part, and I do also allow my Executors should there not be a sufficiency on hand to pay off the above bequeathed debts to sell any property that in their opinion can best be disposed for the purpose of purchasing the same, at any time after my decease that they may deem necessary, and it is further my will & intention that should both or either of my sons die before they come of age the land bequeathed to them be sold by my Executors and the proceeds thereof be equally divided between my surviving children and lastly, I do nominate & appoint my beloved wife Hannah and James Wilson to be the trustees of this my last will & Testament. In the presence whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 30 day of April 1829.

wherein I now live & the other lands before stated which is to be an
inheritance to him, but subject however to the life and income thereof of my
said wife's life or widowhood and lastly on my wife's intestacy
or when my youngest child comes of age, all property not bequeathed
is to be sold by my Executors & the proceeds thereof to be equally
divided among my wife & surviving children each drawing an
equal part, and I do also allow my Executors should there not be
a sufficiency on hand to pay off the above bequeathed debts to sell
any property that in their opinion can best be spared for the
purpose of purchasing the same, at any time after my decease
that they may deem necessary, and it is further my will & pleasure
that should both or either of my sons die before they come of age
the land bequeathed to them be sold by my Executors and the proceeds
thereof be equally divided between my surviving children
And lastly, I do nominate & appoint my beloved wife Hannah and
James Wilson to be the executors of this my last will & Testament—
