fours Shillings Sterling. My executors are well known'd called
William Robt & Margaret Walker, and I do hereby
utterly disallow, Revoke & disannul all & every
other former Testamento, wills, legacies, bequests &
executors by me in any wise before named written
& begone attested, Ratifying & confirming this & no other
is to be my last will & Testamento. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 5th day of
July 1735 - signed, sealed, published
pronounced & declared by the said James Walker
as his last will & Testament in the presence
of us who in the presence of each other
have hereunto subscribed our names -

In the name of God amen, I William Mylin being weak
in body but of sound mind & memory thank be to God
therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and
that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make
& Bid in this my last will & Testament Viz Principals
First of all I give my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I commend
to the dust to be buried in a decent manner at the
discretion of my executors; but as Touching such land
lately wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in
this life, I give & dispose of the same in the following
manner & form Viz. I give & bequeath unto Robert
Mylin my beloved son all that piece or parcel of land
laid off by Daniel McRae by the dividing line b
eginning at a Stake in the field & running
to said dividing line to Elizabeth Weller's open

to him his Hairs & effects forever — Item I give & bequeath
to my beloved Daughter Mary Mylie a man worth eighty
dollars besides Saddle & Bridle & the further bed & car-
pet &c & the furniture to be divided equally between
her & my son James Mylie her keeping her own third of
curtains one Box of Drawers, Two boxes of Cattle out of
the Stock agreeable to her & Sonnes Mylie's pleasure to
be given Mary Mylie at her demand & one third of the
dishes & kitchen furniture — Item I give to my daughter
Mary out of the money that is due to me forty dollars
in Cash or Kitchen furniture which she pleases —
Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son James Mylie all
the rest of my land, together with all the remainder of my
moveable property. Item as for my negro fellow Harry & his
Cherry I allow them for the use the family while my son James
Mylie & daughter Mary Mylie live together & if they see cause to
separate their living then the said two negroes to be paid by
two men & Harry Mylie to have one third of their Value — — —
Item I constitute & appoint my son James Mylie as
Guardian over his mother & have her decently maintained
& provided for during her natural life. Item as for the
wheel right shop tools they are to be divided between my
two Sons Robert & James Mylie — Item I allow my
lawful debts to be paid out of my whole Estate —
Item And I do appoint my son James Mylie to be my sole
Executor of this my last will & Testament, & I do hereby
utterly revoke & disannul all other & former Wills
Testament or Testaments. Ratifying & confirming this to
be the same to be my last Will & Testament in testimony
whereof I the said William Mylie have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 21st day of December 1797 —
