



I give & bequeath to my beloved son Jonathan Casethus

apparel and my bed & furniture — I give & bequeath
to my beloved son by law Samuel Neely one English Crown
I give & bequeath to my two beloved grand sons John &
Samuel Neely ten dollars each of a note of hand given
to me by Andrew Casethus to be equally divided between them
I give & bequeath to my beloved grandson Ezekiel Neely
my Bible & six dollars — I give & bequeath to my beloved
Grand daughter Mary Casethus my spinning wheel —
I give & bequeath to my beloved Grand Daughter Mary Anna
Casethus my Saddle — I give & bequeath to my beloved
Grand son James Casethus my hat —

Likewise I do constitute & appoint my beloved son James
Casethus & my son by law Samuel Neely on whom sedility
I confide my lands & sole Executors of this my last Will &
Testament. Likewise I do now make & publish all
former Wills, Legacies & Bequests, whether ever formerly by
me made, and I do acknowledge this to be my last Will &
Testament, given under my hand & seal this 2^d day of
April 1748. — Signed sealed & acknowledged
by said Sarah Casethus as her last Will and
Testament in presence of us

22 In the Name of God Amen. I William Black being thro
the blessing of a long & good life of years, do break up &
set of & seal & perfect understand my mind, so
concerning this, my last Will & Testament. God give it me
by all as such. And as touching my body, I will entomb it
in the Black River. That all my just Debts be paid.

And first I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife Susan
 my house & Kitchen with all my household furniture, also
 all that I possess on my farm except that which is herein
 after mentioned during her widowhood.

And to my son James I bequeath one third part of my land,
 one third part of said land to my Daughter Ann & the other
 part of said land to my son James & if any of the above
 die before they come of age then the land to devide to the surviving
 or survivors — And to my Daughter Ann I bequeath a
 feather bed bedstead and all the furniture belonging to it, also
 her chest & one pot, also two cows, one black horse called
 Peter with his Saddle & Bridle — And to my Daughter An-
 nie I bequeath one feather Bed bedstead & furniture also a
 Saddle & Bridle — & to my son John I bequeath ten shillings — And I
 desire that all my household furniture which I leave to my
 loving wife to dispose of at her death as she pleases, her
 my Waggon & gears with all my Horses, Cows, Dogs & the
 after the death or widowhood of my wife be disposed of in the
 following manner to be equally divided between the follow-
 ing mentioned children Mary William and Susannah
 and to Hannah Scott I bequeath one Kibbe also one Mop &
 Hopper — And I desire that the grain in the ground, sign
 the use of the family & also the family to be placed on
 farm & stock while they happen to gether in a family con-
 stable — And I do hereby Appoint Joseph Clark & Son
 Clark my executors to see this my last Will & Testament do
 in force, here Recounting all other wills & testaments
 and Testaments in Witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand had this 25th of November 1790.
