

Sally Merritt's Will

State of North Carolina Montgomery County May 19th 1822
 One thousand eight hundred and forty two.
 I Sally Merritt do this day give and will a certain
 tract of land lying and being in the County and State
 aforesaid bounded as follows - Beginning at a post
 oak in said line and runs North seventy one poles to a
 stake by a maple and hickory in Mountain line with it
 West fifty six poles to his corner white oak with said line
 North forty four pole to a Spanish oak then West seventy
 eight poles to a stake then South ten hours and fifteen
 poles to a stake then East twenty poles to said line with it
 North one hundred poles to his corner with his other line east
 one hundred poles to the beginning containing one hundred
 acres more or less which I give to my son & daughter D R Merritt
 to have and to hold their heirs and assigns forever begin
 sealed and signed in the presence my last will and
 testament

Benjamin Rush's Will

I Benjamin Rush of the County of Montgomery County and
 State of North Carolina living of sound mind and memory
 but Considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence
 do make and declare this my last will and testament
 in manner and form following that is to say.

first that my executors hereafter named shall provide
 for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my
 relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together
 with my just debts which are few and small out of the
 money that may justly come into their hands as a part whereof
 of my estate

Item I give and devise to my son Calvert Rush all my
 lands in Mountain Creek also when I shall designate commencing
 at the channel of Mountain Creek in the line line of the mill tract
 and running with the meanders of the Creek to the mouth of a large
 ditch when the Creek now runs thence west ~~and south~~ to the channel
 of the Creek then with the channel to the mouth of a small ditch
 thence with said ditch to the fence below the mill thence with the
 fence to the gate on the south side of the Creek thence to west
 corner till it strikes the mill pond as high as any head of
 water may be raised thence with the meander of the mill
 pond around to a mulberry tree above the mill pond thence
 a direct line to the gate on the north side of the Creek thence
 with the mill road North till it struck the line near the
 Raybridge road thence with the line east till it comes to
 his own line including all the tract and parts of tract
 above when I do grant as the lands before will show estimated
 at eight hundred and fifteen acres also my family gods vessels together
 with the above named lands to him and to hold to him and his
 heirs in fee simple forever.

Item I give and devise to my son Elias D Rush all my lands
 lying on my Creek a branch of Mountain Creek that lies
 south east of Chisholm road called the home tract including
 all the tract and parts of tract lying south and east of a
 Chisholm road turning off from the Raybridge road
 near the old camp ground also a slice of land on
 Mountain Creek bounded as follows. Beginning at the beginning

Course of the mill tract on the west side of Mountain Creek
a rock a short distance from the Creek and running with
the Creek east to the Creek thence with the Creek and thence to his
Brother Calvin H. Rush's boundary to the fence below the mill
thence with the fence to the gate on the North side of the
Creek thence with the mill road his Brother Calvin H. Rush's
boundary to the line near the Stage vehicle road thence with the
line east to the corner a half a mile further east along the
road thence round to the beginning of the land papered with stone
this being estimated at forty acres and the house tract at nine
hundred to the same monies left - It is my will and desire also
that my son Allen H. Rush should inherit my clock and book
case and all that may be found in the desk except money and
paper and also a silver watch which I have worn for many
years all the wear name property I give and desire to my
son Allen H. Rush to have and to hold to him and his heirs
in fee simple forever

Item. I give and desire to my two youngest sons Calvintown
and Allen H. Rush my mills and Cotton gin and all the
business bounded by the land heretofore ~~belonging~~ to them
estimated at twenty acres including the house to the same
monies left to have and to hold as a joint business to them
and their heirs in fee simple forever

Item. All the residue of my lands lying North and West
of the Chinkahen road for which there is a plat I desire to be
left and divided by the sons Calvintown and Allen H. Rush to
have one part in the arrival of the land but if any
other accuse the land to have its own wherein

Item. I give and desire to my grand daughter Elizabeth
green a Negro girl known by the name of Rachael and
feather bed both which she has in hope given to have and
to hold to her and her heirs in fee simple forever

Item. I give and desire to my grand son William H. Rush
one hundred dollars in cash to have and to hold to him
and his heirs in fee simple forever

Item. I give and desire to my grand daughter Maria Elizabeth
one hundred dollars in cash to have and to hold
and her heirs in fee simple forever

Item it is my will and desire that the residue of my
property not named above should be equally divided
among my Children now in number and that my
servants go with my Children and be as favorably
situated as the nature of the case will admit of
particularly the old ones that now help me raise
my Children

And lastly I do hereby Constitute and appoint my
two sons Calvintown and Allen H. Rush whom I place
confidence in my lawful executors to all intents and
purposes to execute this my last will and testament
according to the true intent and meaning of the same
and every part and clause thereof hereby writing
and declaring utterly void all other wills and
testaments by me heretofore made in writing whereof
I the said Benjamin Rush do hereunto set my hand
and seal this twelfth day of October A.D. eighteen
hundred and fifty four
